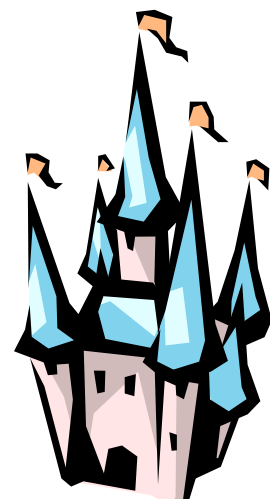

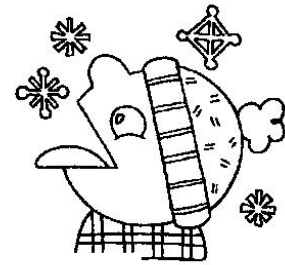
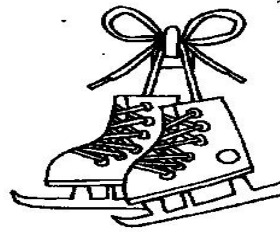

We will offer 3 skill levels. If we don't have enough to form a certain level, then that level will not be held. We will form a call sheet for players that just want to find others that play racquetball- email me if interested.

A Level: Tuesday evenings 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. or TH 11:45 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

Advanced/High Intermediate Players- extremely competitive and skilled. Should play regularly and have effective forehand and backhand shots. They possess a high level of knowledge and have success in executing nearly all shots. Player is able to determine an opponents weakness and maintain a high level of play throughout match. High Intermediate players select the appropriate shots at most times and have some reliability in timing of these shots. There may be some inconsistency, but players of this caliber are seeking and maintain a high level of competition.

B Level: Wednesday 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. (Childcare available) or Tues. 11:45 – 1:00 p.m.

Intermediate Players – are ready to move up the racquetball skill ladder. Players have developed a feel for the game and play somewhat regularly. They enjoy and look forward to playing more. Participants have a pretty good understanding of the skills needed to play and know what to do most of the time on the court. Their execution may be inconsistent, but they play not only for the exercise, but to improve in order to future their game.

C Level: Thursdays 6:00 – 9:00 p.m. or M & W 9 a.m. – Noon (Childcare available)

Beginner Racquetball League – Participants will have the opportunity to learn racquetball the right way. Players should have some experience with the sport and be ready to learn more in order to advance their level of play.
