### FROM THE MAYOR:

Construction on the infrastructure of the Evendale Commons Business Park is moving right along. There has been no announcement of additional tenants lately (Wal-Mart, Fifth Third Bank, Starbucks). I will keep you up to date as the project develops.

Marketing Developments, Inc. has been hired to analyze, investigate and help the Village understand the best use of property along Reading Road and other areas in the Village. Foremost in their analysis are the Village owned parcels on Reading Road. This will be an interesting and exciting time for the Village. The Planning Commission, Village Council and other committees are working toward a realizing a plan that will insure the best possible use of our valuable land for the future. Your comments and suggestions are welcome throughout this process. Please e-mail or telephone me at any time. I welcome the opportunity to discuss the future of the Village with you.

The Village Charter requires a Review Committee every five years. This committee has been selected and should be approved by Council in April.

Much work has been done at the Griffin Family Nature Preserve. More "naturally rugged" paths are being constructed and wildflowers have been planted in the field toward Wyscarver Road. This wild flower area was beautiful last year. Please make a point to walk the paths and fish the lake and enjoy this wonderful natural resource donated to the Village by the Bob Griffin Family.

Work continues on the paths at Gorman Heritage Farm. Hopefully these paths will be walkable by June.

We have received several complaints about garbage. An early Monday morning pick-up necessitates the garbage being placed at the curb on Sunday evening. Since it is the weekend please consider your neighbors and place the garbage at the curb as late as possible. Thank you.

Please be aware if you hire a company to take down trees, it is the company's responsibility to haul the wood away. The Village will only chip brush and small branches. We are not equipped to take care of trees.

Spring is here (even if the weather is not cooperating). Children will be outside enjoying the season. Drive carefully and watch out for the little ones.

## FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT:

### Are you ready for a Thunderstorm?

A thunderstorm is always accompanied by lightning. Thunderstorms are intense local storms averaging 20 miles across and reaching as high as 10 miles. Thunderstorms can occur in all 50 states. Having a family disaster plan is being prepared when harsh weather occurs. The checklist below will help you develop a plan that everyone is familiar with.

- **Pick a safe place in your home where family members can gather during a thunderstorm. This should be a place where there are no windows, skylights, or glass doors.**

- ❑ **Discuss how you would know if a tornado were part of a thunderstorm. Does your community have warning devices? (Yes, Hamilton County has outside warning devices, sirens.) What other ways would you be notified of a tornado watch or warning?**

- ❑ **Show children how to squat low to the ground to be the smallest target possible for lightning in case they get caught outside in a thunderstorm. Show them how to place their hands on their knees with their heads between their knees.**

- ❑ **Assemble a disaster supplies kit in a clearly labeled, easy to grab container.**

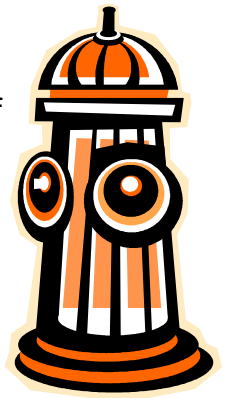

### **Fire Hydrants to be flushed**

Starting in April, the fire department will be flushing fire hydrants. This process could cause staining of laundry during the flushing process. Contact the station for a product that will help remove the stain from clothing while doing laundry. Also, the discolored water is safe; it is caused by corrosion in the pipes that carry the water from the treatment plant to your homes. The discolored water meets all health-based regulations. The flushing of hydrants causes the sediments within the pipes to stir due to the amounts of water flowing from the hydrants. If you have any questions or concerns about the water or time of which we will be conducting the flushing of the hydrants, please feel free to contact the station at 563-2248.
