COUNCIL BUSINESS: ADOPTED ORDINANCES

The following ordinances and resolutions were adopted by the Council of the Village of Evendale at its Regular Council Meeting on October 13, 2005.

- Res 05-12 RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION & AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR
- Ord 05-42 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO HIRE A PART-TIME EMPLOYEE, MARK HESSE, IN THE RECREATION DEPARTMENT AND SETTING THE PAY RATE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- Ord 05-43 APPROVING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS IN VARIOUS FUNDS DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- Ord 05-44 ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 258.121 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE, DEFINING PERSONAL LEAVE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- Ord 05-47 ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1612 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE AMENDING THE FIRE PREVENTION CODE, PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS GOVERNING CONDITIONS HAZARDOUS TO LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM FIRE OR EXPLOSION AND DEFINING THE OFFICERS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CODE'S ENFORCEMENT AND DEFINING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- Ord 05-48 ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 1614 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE AND PROVIDING MEANS FOR THE AUTOMATIC EXTINGUISHMENT OF FIRE, FIRE ALARM, AND VENTILATION EQUIPMENT IN BUILDINGS OR PARTS OF BUILDINGS WHICH BECAUSE OF THEIR SIZE, CONSTRUCTION OR OCCUPANCY OR LACK OF SUITABLE PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT CONSTITUTE A SPECIAL FIRE HAZARD TO LIFE OR PROPERTY, OR AN EXCESSIVE BURDEN UPON THE FIRE EXTINGUISHING FACILITIES OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- Ord 05-49 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER FOR THE PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, TRANSFERRING FUNDS AND MAKING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THAT PURPOSE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

2005 LEAF BAG DISTRIBUTION LAST CHANCE

The Village of Evendale will be providing leaf bags for residents again this year. The method of pickup and disposal will be as follows:

1. Leaf bags supplied by the Village **ENDS on Saturday, November 5, 2005.**
2. Leaf bag distribution will be from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
3. There will be a limit of twelve (12) leaf bags per household per Saturday.
4. To achieve equitable distribution of bags, you will have to personally sign for your bags each week. This will be strictly enforced. You will not be able to pick up bags for anyone other than your household. If you not able to pick up your leaf bags, and will be sending someone else to pick up your leaf bags, please notify the Public Works Department, in writing, prior to picking up the bags.
5. Leaf bags are to be picked up from the Public Works Department, the large white building west of the intersection of Glendale-Milford Road and Kingsport Drive on the municipal grounds.
6. Filled leaf bags will be picked up by Rumpke, on your regular trash day. Please place bags at the curb with your regular trash.
7. For the safety of the Rumpke employees, please do not overfill leaf bags. Yard waste debris should not extend beyond the top of the bag.

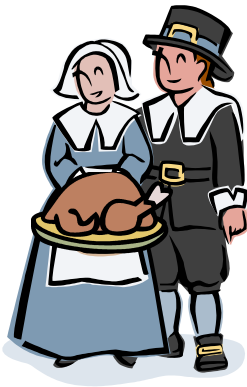
