## **COUNCIL BUSINESS: ADOPTED ORDINANCES**

The following ordinance was adopted by the Council of the Village of Evendale at its Special Council Meeting on August 23, 2005.

ORD #05-37 ORDINANCE APPROVING WATER MANAGEMENT AND SEDIMENTATION CONTROL PLANS FOR EVENDALE COMMONS BUSINESS PARK AND AUTHORIZING BUILDING COMMISSIONER TO ISSUE PERMIT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

### ***INTRODUCING SERGEANT NIEL KORTE***

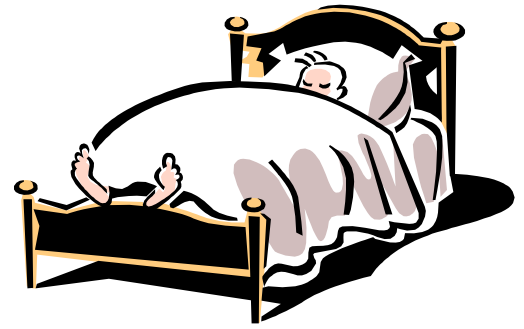

## FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT:

# Sleepover Safety for Kids

Are your children beginning to spend the night at friend's houses? Have they been asking for friends to spend the night at your house? If so then you may have questions that you should be asking yourself. Here is a simply checklist:



Before saying 'yes'

- How well do you know the home they are going to?
- Does the homeowner keep the home clean?
- Is the home in a safe area of town?
- Are your children comfortable in the home with other members of the family?
- Does the other family have an escape plan and meeting place in case of emergencies?
- Are you comfortable with your child being at this residence overnight?

How well do you know the family?

- Are the parents going to be home during the entire stay?
- Do they practice fire safety; are they cautious with smoking, candle and other burning materials?
- Are they mature enough to be responsible for your child?

Questions to ask

- Are the smoke alarms in the house working properly?
- Where will your child be sleeping?
- Does the family have a secondary escape plan from the room the children are sleeping in?

Does your child...

- Know what a smoke alarm sounds like?
- Know what to do when an alarm is heard in the house?
- Know the emergency number to contact the fire department?
- Speak up if they don't feel comfortable with a situation?

Following this advice could help save the lives and extend the fun of having sleepovers.

## FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

### 2005 LEAF BAG DISTRIBUTION

The Village of Evendale will be providing leaf bags for residents again this year. The method of pickup and disposal will be as follows:

1. Leaf bags will be supplied by the Village on Saturdays only, beginning Saturday, October 1, 2005. Distribution will be for six (6) weeks, ending Saturday, November 5, 2005.
2. Leaf bag distribution will be from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.
3. There will be a limit of twelve (12) leaf bags per household per Saturday.
4. To achieve equitable distribution of bags, you will have to personally sign for your bags each week. This will be strictly enforced. You will not be able to pick up bags for anyone other than your household. If you not able to pick up your leaf bags, and will be sending someone else to pick up your leaf bags, please notify the Public Works Department, in writing, prior to picking up the bags.

5. Leaf bags are to be picked up from the Public Works Department, the large white building west of the intersection of Glendale-Milford Road and Kingsport Drive on the municipal grounds.
6. Filled leaf bags will be picked up by Rumpke, on your regular trash day. Please place bags at the curb with your regular trash.
7. For the safety of the Rumpke employees, please do not overfill leaf bags. Yard waste debris should not extend beyond the top of the bag.

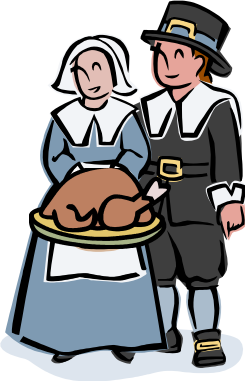

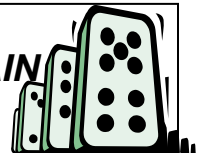
