FROM THE MAYOR:

Evendale has been saddened by the death of Marine Lance Corporal Chris Dyer. The Village offers condolences to his father John Dyer and Family. To honor Chris' memory Mr. Dyer has asked each of us to do something kind for someone that we would not ordinarily do. Our thoughts and prayers continue to be with the family, friends and neighbors of this courageous young resident who gave his life for humankind.

A new walking path has been constructed at The Griffin Family Nature Preserve. The Village has planted wildflowers that add to the beauty in the Wyscarver Road area. - ORD 05-33 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE POLICE CHIEF TO SELL TWO USED POLICE CARS TO THE COLLEGE OF MT. ST. JOSEPH ON THE OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
- ORD 05-34 ORDINANCE AMENDING PROVISIONS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE RELATING TO THE VILLAGE CLERK AND THE CHIEF FISCAL AND ACCOUNTING OFFICER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT:

INTRODUCING SERGEANT JOE ASBROCK

Sgt. Asbrock has been with the Evendale Police Department for 17 years, 9 of those years as a sergeant. Prior to coming to Evendale, he worked for 6 years as Security Supervisor for Kings Island and as a wrestling coach at Moeller High School.

Joe has an Associate's Degree in Liberal Arts from Raymond Walters College, a Bachelor of Science Degree in Law Enforcement & Corrections from the University of Cincinnati, and has only his thesis to complete for a Master's Degree in Police Administration.

Sgt. Asbrock was the first D.A.R.E. officer in Evendale and started the first D.A.R.E. program in a deaf school in the State of Ohio. He is trained in D.A.R.E. at the junior high school level. Joe was one of our first bike officers. He is an instructor in the ASP, PR-24, and unarmed self-defense.

Joe and his wife, Stacie, have 3 children – Carey, 11; Kenton, 9, and Isabella, 6. He enjoys spending time with his family, hunting, fishing, and spending time on his farm in Kentucky.

Young Rembrandts Pre-School Drawing Classes, Ages 3 ½ - 6

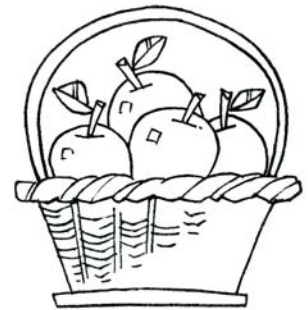

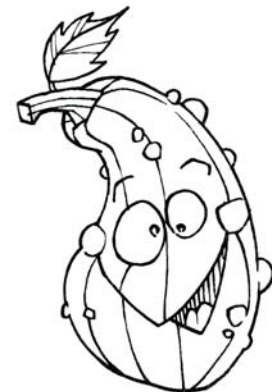
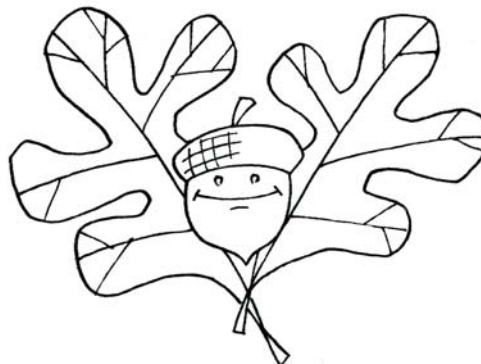
