

Have you ever wanted to see a fire truck built? I had the fortunate opportunity to travel with Chief Hauck and five firemen to visit Pierce Manufacturing, Inc., in Appleton, Wisconsin, for the final inspection and acceptance of the Village's new fire truck. It was an amazing trip!!

This plant currently has 125 fire trucks under construction. They receive orders from cities, counties and villages from all over the United States. They have delivered trucks to countries in the Far East, Africa and the oil patch. Although the most popular color is red, they have every color of the rainbow. We saw a truck painted blue, which looked more like a bus to me.

The process of researching and designing the truck, securing the money, and building our truck has taken over two years. It will have a 500 horse power diesel engine so it can easily navigate hills like Glendale-Milford Road. It can carry up to 1,000 gallons of diesel fuel. The built-in safety equipment makes the truck light up like a Christmas tree.

This new fire apparatus cost came to over \$650,000. I'm glad that we purchased it when we did because two price increases have occurred since then.

We will have the formal Pushing-In ceremony for the public in mid-March. Look for details in later editions of the newsletter and on the web site.

FIRE DEPARMENT

The Evendale Fire Department will celebrate the delivery and in service of a new fire engine in March with a "Pushing-in" ceremony at the Station, 10500 Reading Rd. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

The new engine apparatus' capabilities will be a regional asset that will be used not only for Evendale residents, but also be available through our mutual aid system for emergencies in surrounding jurisdictions in Hamilton County and beyond, if requested. This apparatus and the equipment it carries will greatly increase the safety of the Village and surrounding areas with its ability to use foam in firefighting, reducing the amount of water and potential damage to structures from water. We greatly appreciate our community, Village Management, and the Council's vision and support of our Department and their willingness to equip us with the right tools to protect our community.

The pushing-in ceremony is a tradition dating back to the 19th century when manufacturers would deliver a new pumper wagon to the fire station with a team of horses. Since the team of horses couldn't back up, the receiving party would unhitch the wagon, push it back into the station, load up the equipment and hitch their own team of horses, making it ready for its first response.

The ceremony is the culmination of more than two years of work by a committee of Evendale officers and firefighters who researched and set the specifications of the custombuilt apparatus.

The 35 foot 2016 Pierce Manufacturing Truck is equipped with:

- 2016 Velocity FR cab and chassis
- Detroit 505 horse power, diesel engine
- Allison automatic transmission
- Harris 20KW generator
- Command Light, Light Tower with LED lights
- 2000 gallons per minute Hale pump
- Class 'A' & 'B' foam capable
- Holmatro hydraulic rescue tools
- Scott Safety breathing apparatus
- High/low angle rescue gear
- · Bullard thermal imaging camera



The purchase price of the new truck was \$697,000 which includes any new tools, and equipment that was needed. This truck will become the front line apparatus while the 2002 Sutphin Engine will be moved to a reserve status and the 1991 Sutphin Engine will be sold to another fire department. The apparatus will go into service around the same time as the ceremony. Please check our new Facebook and Twitter pages for more information on the ceremony.



ADMINISTRATION

Evendale Village Council recently passed an ordinance creating a rental registration program applicable to all residential rental properties in the Village. The

program was created to help protect the health, safety and general welfare of residents living in rental property by establishing minimum standards for the maintenance and upkeep of the exterior and interior of homes. According to the Hamilton County Auditors Rental Registry, there are approximately 20 known single family homes currently rented in Evendale. Effective immediately, rental property owners are to submit an application for a rental permit to the Village Building Department. The application fee is \$100 per property. Applicants can then schedule an inspection of their property with the Building Commissioner or they may waive the inspection by signing a sworn affidavit testifying that their property is code compliant. The Commissioner will work with property owners and tenants to resolve code violations. While the Village seeks voluntary compliance, owners and/or tenants could face penalties and legal charges should they fail to comply with the Code. Permits are valid for five years unless a change in occupancy occurs, at which time Permits must be renewed and an inspection scheduled or waiver signed prior to the new occupancy. Evendale code prohibits more than four occupancy changes per year.

The creation of the rental registration program was the result of a multi-year study and overall revision of the Village's property maintenance code, applicable to all residential properties. The property maintenance code restricts the parking/storage of junk vehicles, prohibits exterior trash accumulation and requires deteriorated structural conditions such as broken windows, rotted siding, etc. to be repaired or replaced. The majority of Evendale's housing stock well exceeds the minimum standards set by the code.


