# FIRE DEPARTMENT

Top 10 Fireworks Safety Tips:

- Obey local laws. In Ohio unless it's a novelty that
  fits into one of the four S's (sparklers, snakes,
  snaps or smoke bombs) it's ill to set off. That
  means firecrackers, roman candles, bottle rockets and the more heavy-duty shells are not permitted.
- Use fireworks outdoors only. Never carry fireworks in a pocket or shoot them off in metal or glass containers. Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- 3. Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities. Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks including sparklers. Only persons over the age of 12 should be allowed to handle sparklers of any type.
- 4. Avoid buying fireworks packaged in brown paper. This is often a sign that the fireworks were made for professional displays and that they could pose a danger to consumers.
- 5. **Be careful when lighting the fuse.** Never place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device when lighting the fuse. Light fireworks one at a time, then quickly back up to a safe distance.
- 6. **Never relight a "dud" firework.** Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- 7. **Only use fireworks as intended.** Don't try to alter them or combine them.
- 8. Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap. After fireworks complete their burning, douse the spent device with plenty of water before discarding it to prevent a trash fire.
- 9. **Use common sense.** Spectators should keep a safe distance from the shooter and the shooter should wear safety glasses.
- 10. Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Have a "designated shooter".



# POLICE DEPARTMENT

Good Morning Evendale has been established by the Village's police, fire and recreation departments to provide a daily well-check phone call to senior residents. This program will assist residents in main-

taining their independence while also giving piece of mind to relatives and friends.

Each morning a Village employee will make a phone call to the resident between 9:00am – 9:30am. The caller will say, "Good Morning Evendale", followed with an introduction. The caller will ask if all is well. If a phone call is not answered or there is a problem, the caller will go to the notification list and attempt to reach the primary and/or secondary contacts. If the contacts can't be reached, a member of the police or fire department will be sent to the resident's home to check on their well-being.

This is a voluntary program. The Village's goal is to provide a piece of mind for the resident and their loved ones. Should assistance be needed we will be there for them. # **ADMINISTRATION DEPARMENT**

The Village of Evendale has contracted with **CallMultiplier** to provide emergency notifications to residents and businesses of Evendale. The CallMultiplier system delivers notifications via your regular

phone line and/or your mobile phone. The Village will activate alerts for emergency incidents and other events that affect the residents **and** businesses of Evendale.

In order to receive these notifications you can mail or drop off the completed CallMultiplier form to the Evendale Fire Department. The form can be found on the Village website. The forms also available at the Fire, Recreation and Administration offices. Your participation in this notification system is voluntary. This database is held by CallMultiplier Notification and its security is guaranteed by CallMultiplier Notification.

**Disclaimer**: Please be aware that while we believe the CallMultiplier Notification system is an excellent tool to serve the needs of the Village and our residents, it is not infallible. Everyone should use common sense and pay attention to weather sirens and weather reports. The Village of Evendale is not liable if the CallMultiplier Notification fails or is not activated in times of emergency.


