Dear Neighbors and Friends:

We were in the process of producing a better digital image of our Village seal. We use this same seal on our flag, letterhead, business cards and almost everything associated with the Village. As we were reviewing the seal, we began wondering what the Latin wording on the seal, Novus Ordo Seclorum, meant. After some detective work we learned that the English translation is roughly "New Order of the Ages" which is also on the back of the US dollar bill. However, there are those who tend to side with the conspiracy theorists who have interpreted the phrase to mean "New World Order".

Our seal originated in 1968, when Phi Lambda Pi held a contest to design the Village flag. The seal was part of the winning flag design submitted by Randy Dimond, son of Dr. Harold and Alice Dimond. The young man won a \$100 bond as the winner. I feel that it is time to update our seal to reflect today's Evendale and replace the wording, preferably in English. If you have any suggestions please let us know.


There have been concerns raised by residents in regards to lead plumbing pipes in their homes. According to the Cincinnati Water Works, generally this is found in homes built prior to 1930; however, age of a structure alone may not be a reliable indicator.

A simple scratch test can be performed to determine if a plumbing line is lead. Use a coin and scratch the waterline coming into your home. If the pipe scratches easily and the mark is shiny and silver, then your service line may need to be tested for lead. A free water test kit, can be requested from Cincinnati Water Works by filling out the information listed on the online form at (<u>https://ctsprdweb.cincinnati-h.gov/apps/watercheck/leadanalysis.aspx</u>). Once you receive the kit follow the instructions on performing the test and return the kit to Cincinnati Water Works for testing. This is a free service and may take several weeks to return the results.

ADMINISTRATION DEPARMENT

Evendale officials have been actively monitoring Duke Energy's proposed gas line extension project. The pro-

posed 12-mile extension begins at a point North of I-275 in Sycamore Township and ends in the Norwood/ Fairfax area. Duke has proposed 3 route options, one of which runs through Evendale. Evendale was the first municipality to file written opposition of the line with the Ohio Power Siting Board, the state authority that permits or denies gas line extensions. POLICE DEPARTMENT

Feeding deer, especially in a subdivision, could be a death sentence for them. This may sound a bit "over-the-top" but research supports the notion that it is a bad

idea to feed them. We understand that many people enjoy seeing wildlife in their yards but several problems occur when deer are attracted to yards due to intentional or unintentional (bird feeders) supplemental feeding. Deer attracted to areas due to supplemental feeding will more than likely browse on landscaping plants and trees costing homeowners unnecessary expenses. With the concentration of deer to a particular area the potential for the spread of infectious diseases, especially the fatal Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD), increases. CWD has been reported in captive herds in Ohio and the division of wildlife recommends against feeding deer for this reason. Another more complicated issue involves the deer's finely tuned digestive system. A deer's diet in the winter is different from the other months of the year and their bodies naturally adapt. The increase in carbohydrates from corn or other wildlife feeds could be fatal. Deer can survive for up to a month in the winter without feeding. Mother Nature has wired them to survive without human intervention and it's best to keep it that way.


