Dear Neighbors and Friends,

Duke has now officially filed the application with the Ohio Power Siting Board. This occurred after Duke held another public hearing to present the changes they had made. They have now reduced the size of the pipe from 30" to 20" and the pressure from about 750 pounds psi to 450 pounds psi. The village is still on the alternative route and if we are chosen, many businesses and homes in Evendale will be affected.

With the filing of the application, Evendale can now begin the process of intervening. We are joining with Cincinnati and other jurisdictions in this fight. This helps with the legal bills, which can be high. There will be two more public hearings, one in Columbus and one in Cincinnati. The Power Siting Board makes the final decision. Duke can now begin collecting easements from property owners on the preferred route. As noted above, we are not on that list.

If they do select the alternative route, be very careful what you sign. If you are not familiar with easements, you might want to have your attorney look at the document.

## Getting to Know Your Neighbors



Dr. Hugh McKinnon is President (Chair) of Evendale's Community Improvement Corporation, or CIC. Hugh served on the CIC for two 3-year terms before becoming President 4 years ago. Ohio law authorizes appointment of CICs to purchase and sell property, shielding the community's elected officials from potential or real conflicts of interest. In Evendale, as in many other Ohio

communities, the CIC essentially oversees and encourages economic development for the Village. Most recently our CIC has been marketing Evendale's land-banked properties, with priority on properties west of I-75 referred to as "AeroHub."

Hugh is a physician trained in Public Health and Environmental Medicine who spent his career in the U.S. Civil Service. He retired in 2004 after serving as Director of the U.S. EPA's National Research Laboratory adjacent to the University of Cincinnati. Hugh is an Elder in Blue Ash Presbyterian Church, and he is currently President of the Rotary Club of Northeast Cincinnati (formerly Blue Ash-Montgomery). He loves travel, reading, bicycling and golf, and plays in the Evendale Beckett Ridge Golf League with his partner, Tom Sextro.

Hugh and his wife Diane have lived in Carpenter's Creek in Evendale since moving here from the Washington, D.C. area in 1995. They have three daughters – Meg Niederhelman lives in Covington, KY with her husband Josh and two sons, A.J. and Drew; Carrie Schwerdtmann lives in Loveland with her husband John and two sons, Ben and Graham; and Josie McKinnon also lives in Covington and works for Prestige Travel in Montgomery.

## ADMINISTRATION

Evendale continues to offer electric and gas aggregation programs. Dynegy is the electric supplier currently offering a fixed rate of 5.89 cents per kilowatt per hour thru December 2017. Constellation is the gas supplier currently offering a fixed rate of 4.576 cents per ccf thru April 2017. Evendale residents are automatically enrolled in these programs unless they chose to "opt-out" or are currently enrolled with another supplier. There is no fee to enroll in or exit the programs. Monthly gas/electric bills will continue to be processed by Duke Energy, who remains the generator and distributor of gas and electric. Both the supplier name and rate paid is identified on each bill. 

## Did you know...

Just six years after Evendale was incorporated and two years before Evendale built the original Recreation Center, the first meeting of the Evendale Recreation Department was held on January 29, 1957. Residents formed basketball teams and competed against each other as soon as the Recreation Center was opened. A Class C baseball team was organized by the village in 1962; Soccer was introduced in 1967.

The Recreation Center wasn't just about sports. The center provided Residents of all ages with a wide variety of classes, programs and special events. In the 1970's they offered trampoline classes, held Friday night sock hops, and the Shelter House was built. In the 1980's the racquetball courts were added and the Rainbow Connection program entertained our children during the summer. The major renovation of the center that doubled the size of the facility and our current swimming facility occurred in the early 1990's. The construction of our new municipal building and fire house happened in 1996. In the 2000's the amphitheater and second shelter house were added to the grounds and the Evendale Eagles established themselves as a first-rate swim team program.

Though many changes have occurred since that first meeting of the Recreation Department, their mission remains the same, "To improve the quality of life for all residents of Evendale by providing a wide variety of leisure and cultural activities, special events, facilities, and services that encourage health, fitness, relaxation, enjoyment, cultural enrichment and learning, as well as providing opportunities for community involvement".

**ORD. #16-77** – An ordinance **prohibiting medical marijuana cultivators, processors and retail dispensary establishments** licensed under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 3796 within the Village of Evendale. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #16-90 (3<sup>rd</sup> Reading)** – An ordinance adopting a **transitional work policy** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**RES. #17-03** – A resolution **appointing specialists in the Service Department for 2017** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**RES. #17-04** – A resolution to take those steps necessary to **comply with the Ohio Uniform Depository Act** and designate an Active, Interim and Inactive accounts. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #17-09** – Ordinance authoring the Mayor to **hire various Permanent Part-Time positions for the Recreation Department** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #17-10** – Ordinance **clarifying appointments to the Cultural Arts Center Commission** of the Village of Evendale and declaring an emergency. Approved

**ORD. #17-11** – An ordinance authorizing the **payment of amount due upon certain contracts requiring certification of availability of funds** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #7-12** – Ordinance approving a **transfer from the General Fund to appropriate funds for a donation made to the Center for Addiction Treatment Building Project** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #17-13** – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into a **design contract for the AeroHub project** within Evendale and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #17-15** – An ordinance authoring the Mayor or his designee to approve an agreement permitting the **bleachers currently on the former Landmark property purchased by the Village of Evendale to be donated** to the Cincinnati Board of Education for use at the new Aiken High School football field and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

**ORD. #17-16** – An ordinance establishing a **rental registration permit fee** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously approved

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary
