GORMAN HERITAGE FARM

We raise chickens from spring through fall, processing them each month. May 5th will be the first date in which our farm fresh chickens will be available. These chickens are raised without antibiotics or hormones, which makes the meat extremely tender and juicy. Be sure to reserve your chickens now for future processing dates. A limited quantity of farm raised pork, eggs, and local honey is also available. Blue Oven Bread is at GHF every Thursday from 1:30 pm – 5:00 pm to sell their fresh breads.

While at the farm take a moment to meet all the baby chicks, piglets, calves and lambs we have right now. The farm provides free horse drawn wagon rides every Friday, 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm.

Did you know that the GHF has two American Miniature Horses? GHF Harness Club volunteers offer a five hour class, Miniature Horses 101, every Saturday morning. Registration is required. Please check out our website for more information or call us at 563-6663.



SERVICE DEPARTMENT

During the months of April through November, the Service Department will drop off a dump truck at your home if you have a large amount of debris you need to throw away. We will deliver the truck in the afternoon and pick it up the next morning. **We cannot accept the following items:** paint, oil, batteries, tires, chemicals, appliances with Freon, and any building materials left by contractors. Please contact us at 563-4338 if you have any questions or you want to schedule a truck.

Upholstered furniture or mattresses are picked up by our curb side trash collection company, Republic Services. These items must be wrapped in plastic before placing them at the curb. Please call Republic Services directly at 771-4200 to schedule a pick up date. You can also call Republic Services to get your trash and/or recycling bin replaced.

Small branches and twigs are considered yard waste and should be placed in your trash bin, not set out along the curb for our chipping crew.



POLICE DEPARTMENT

Every spring, the police department receives calls from concerned residents reporting that they have found an abandoned deer fawn. The calls report the finding of a fawn and the mother nowhere to be found. It is completely normal for a doe (mother deer) to leave her fawn in an area so that she can feed and rest worry free. The doe does this to protect the fawn from predators. Fawns give off very little scent as compared to a full grown doe and therefore it is difficult for predators to find them. Although you seldom see the doe, rest assured she is close by and probably watching you. Leave the fawn alone. Back away and without a doubt, it will be gone within the hour.

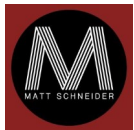
