## Fire, Police, Service, Engineering, and Code Enforcement Council Committee June 13, 2016

Attendees: Councilmembers McDaniel, Smiley-Robertson, and Ranz. Fire Chief Hauck, Police Chief Korte, Service Director Bothe, Village Engineer Jeffers and Village Building Commissioner Mercer. Also attending Mayor Finan, and Village Fiscal Officer Carracci.

Meeting called to order at 4:00 p.m.

FIRE: Ordinance on June meeting agenda to enter into an agreement with Medicount Management for the billing of emergency medical services. Chief recommended an increase of \$100 for each category and the committee agreed. This is the first increase in about 5 years and will keep us in line with the county averages.

Fire Department will be placing a retired flag collection box and a Little Free Library Box in the outer lobby of the Fire Department Building.

Tri-Health Occupational Medicine will be conducting the fire and police department's physicals this year. A mobile unit will be on-site in October.

The Fire Department will be receiving an EMS Recognition Award from the American Heart Association on June 23<sup>rd</sup> at a reception at The Christ Hospital.

POLICE: On July 4<sup>th</sup>, there will be No Parking signs on Woodleigh, Cooper Hill, and Winnebago.

SERVICE: The new truck is currently being equipped and will be back to the village by the end of September.

ENGINEERING: (Report attached) Construction of the Glendale-Milford / Plainfield Rd. turn lane should begin this week and should be completed before the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

TLC building is down, and grading should be complete in about 2 weeks.

The preliminary design work for the campus entrance signs is complete. Construction should begin within the next couple of weeks.

Ordinance on June agenda to transfer funds for a geotechnical study for the new Glendale-Milford bridge over I-75. Our plans have been approved by ODOT. Bidding process is expected to start in February of 2017.

CODE ENFORCEMENT: Public hearings will be scheduled for both Planning Commission and Council Meetings – probably in July.

OTHER BUSINESS: A resolution OPPOSING the Duke Energy proposed central corridor pipeline extension project is on the June council agenda.
