1. Fire
 - a. Committee had more discussion regarding a 48-work week
 - b. Started the hiring process for 3 new firefighters. There are 3 applicants and the hiring process is closed.
 - c. Oct 2-9 Fallen Fire Fighter – Light the Night Red
2. Police
 - a. Department update- the new supervisors are in place and doing well
 - b. Ordinance- \$20,000 capital items for Chevy Tahoe cruiser which do much better on the resale end. They will be outfitted in 2023 for safety equipment.
 - c. Debriefing -Princeton School incident- there were 10 incidents in Ohio and the call was tracked to California but the call came from somewhere else. Not sure if it was testing of police department response time or just nuisance. It was a good training incident. Poor information was getting to parents. The responding departments met to debrief regarding response. Over 100 officers were on the scene with 20 minutes.
3. Cultural Arts Center – Ms. Gordy was not in attendance but submitted a written report and attached
4. Building, Planning and Zoning
 - a. No report
5. Other business
 - a. AEP 2-year gas aggregation - .839 per ccf with is double last year but lower than Duke. Beginning to work with Energy Alliance for new electric rates. The market does not look good so probably not switching until the summer and will default back to Duke in the time being.
 - b. Town meeting Nov 6
 - c. The mayor would like to hire Carolyn Carmody for treasurer of VOE.
