Another reminder is that home weather radios are available for purchase at our Fire Department at a cost of \$20.00.

I am proud to announce that Evendale residents and businesses recycled over 300 tons of metal glass, plastic and paper in 2014. Your efforts conserved enough energy to power every home in Evendale for 14 days and saved 1,793 trees from being harvested. In addition, our annual Shred Day was tremendous success.
