Dear Neighbors and Friends:

I am still looking for volunteers for the Charter Review Committee. The time commitment is minimal and it is a wonderful way to learn how Evendale's governmental body works.

In the past several weeks, the Village has experiences an unusually large number of electrical outages. We are working with Duke Energy to determine the cause for these outages and to correct any problems. Please contact Duke at 1-800-543-5599 or www.duke-energy.com/ohio.asp to report an outage or to receive an update on a current outage.

Evendale is initiating an electric aggregation opt-out program for eligible residents, comparable to, but separate from, Evendale's current gas opt-out aggregation program. Dynegy (formerly Duke Energy Retail), the electric supplier, will hold two public hearings for the residents on Monday, May 18th at 2:00 pm and 6:00 pm to explain the program and answer questions. Residents eligible to participate in the program will receive a letter from Dynegy in late July with specific rate and enrollment details. Residents may opt-out of the program before it begins or anytime thereafter with no penalty.

To improve the safety and well-being of our facility/park users, the Village has installed a Lightning Prediction System on the roof of the Recreation Center - above the main lobby area. This highly sophisticated sensor and computer will sound one long, 15-second blast from an air horn, followed by a continual flashing strobe light, upon detecting lightning strikes within a two-mile radius. All outdoor activities on the complex will stop and everyone will be asked to seek immediate shelter, such as a vehicle or building. An open-air shelter is not considered a safe location. The "all clear" signal, consisting of three short, five-second blasts, will be sounded once the imminent threat of a lightning strike has passed. This system will be operational seven days a week, March through November.

At the April Council meeting, Steve Moore, Princeton City School Board representative, presented potential negative effects of proposed State cuts to the tangible personal property tax (TPP) revenues for local school districts.
