Dear Neighbor and Friends:

I wanted to provide you with an update on the lawsuit involving our Municipal Income Tax so that you can stay informed. Last December, a suit was filed in Franklin County Ohio for those Municipalities challenging the constitutionality of HB49. If you recall, that bill allowed businesses to "opt-in" and choose to file and pay their Net Profit returns centrally with the State of Ohio rather than filing and paying with the municipality. The provision went further and made the State Tax Commissioner the Administrator of any municipal Net Profit Returns filed through the "opt-in" method. That gives the State Tax Commissioner the authority to administer and collect our Net Profit Tax.

In addition, the State's plan would allow them to collect the tax and distribute it back to the Village about 30-60 days after they receive it (depending on the day of the month they receive the payment and certify it). They will charge the Village a 0.5% fee for doing so. We believed these provisions of HB49 to be unconstitutional, and in violation of our Home Rule. So we joined forces with about 200 other Ohio municipalities in challenging the State of Ohio. The first hearing in Franklin Co. was to request a stay on the HB49 provisions, which were to go into effect 1/1/18. That stay was denied in February of 2018. An appeal has been filed.

We believe strongly that this action by the State must continue to be challenged or the State will continue to take control of Municipal Earning Tax as a whole, not only the Net Profit Tax. While the current HB49 provisions effect only the Net Profit Tax and is optional, our fear is that State is beginning to lay the groundwork for control over Withholding and Individual Income Tax and that they will make it mandatory in the future.

Not only our Police and Fire services are dependent upon this revenue, all Village services will be affected if the State is ultimately victorious. If we can't collect our tax, we can't control the timing of receipts; if we can't administer our tax, we can't verify accuracy and compliance, and we can't control their fees to collect. As I mentioned in the November Newsletter, my fear is that when the State needs money in the future for their funding or to balance their budget, and they have control of Municipalities' Earning Tax, we may lose our earnings tax just as we did the Local Government Fund. Loss of control to the State of Ohio could mean financial disaster for the Village.

We will continue to fight this action in the courts and we will continue to keep you posted.

TAX DEPARTMENT

Evendale Tax Filing Reminders:

FILE BY April 17, 2018 The 2017 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return is due on or before April 17, 2018.

- SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER When preparing the Evendale Income Tax Return, please do not enter your complete SSN on the tax return.
- ATTACHMENTS REQUIRED The Federal Tax Return (Form 1040, pg 1) must be attached to the Evendale Tax Return, along with all W-2's and other applicable schedules (the SSN may be redacted from these documents before mailing)
- TAX FORMS Tax Returns and additional tax information are available on our website <u>www.evendaleohio.org</u>. Forms may not be submitted electronically, however, a fillable pdf is available to assist with certain calculations.
- **SIGN AND DATE** The return must be signed and dated by the taxpayer(s).
- SECURE DROP BOX A secure drop box is available for the Tax Department and is located in the lobby of the Police Department. The Police Department lobby is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- **GETTING ASSISTANCE** Help with your Evendale Tax Return is available for free. Please contact Cindy Vaske, Tax Administrator, at 513-563-2671, or by email at cindy.vaske@evendaleohio.org.

Ord. #18-16 – Ordinance supporting the Mill Creek Restoration Project near Formica and authoring the Mayor to submit an application for Clean Ohio Funds Green Space Conservation Program through the Natural Resources Assistance Council and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-06 – Ordinance amending a portion of the zoning map of the Village of Evendale, Ohio from General Commercial (GC) to Office/Research (OR) and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-07 – Ordinance amending Chapters 1252 and 1260 of the Evendale Zoning Code as related to Office/ Research (OR) District regulations and declaring an emergency.

Ord. #18-09 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to hire and set pay rates for part-time employees for the Recreation Department and declaring an emergency. Approved

Ord. #18-21 – Ordinance accepting a conservation easement for the Mill Creek Watershed Council of Communities over property identified as Hamilton County Auditor's Parcel #611-0020-0402-00 and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-22 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into contract with the lowest and best bidder for the Mill Creek Restoration Project through Evendale Commons and approving appropriations related to said project and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary.

> HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT PROGRAM FOR YOUR CHILD: Read through the following level descriptions to carefully match your child's current level.

> Frogs & Tadpoles - Mommy & Me (6 months - 3 years)- This is an interactive class and we recommend that the child has at least the ability to hold his/her head up independently. There will be a strong emphasis on safety, water acclimation, and teaching through game/ song and parent involvement.

> Flounder Skills - Water Exploration child must be able to leave parent. Child will become acclimated to the water through games. Child will learn basic safety skills in addition to water submersion and floating with support.

> Jellvfish Skills - Primarv Skills - child needs to be acclimated to water. Child will learn to be in the water unassisted on both front and back positions. Bobbing, floating, and kicking will be the main focus of this level. Safety and learning through games will still be incorporated into this level.

> Octopus Skills - Stroke Readiness child is comfortable floating unassisted on both front and back. Child can recover from float to standing position unassisted and be able to have a propulsive kick. Child will begin learning freestyle, backstroke, elementary backstroke, treading water, and diving. Safety skills and games will also be incorporated into this level.

> Clownfish Skills - Stroke Development child must be able to swim novice freestyle and backstroke, be able to jump in and return to the side unassisted, tread water for 10 seconds, and know the basics of the breaststroke and butterfly kicks. Endurance will be increased in all skills.



Did You Know...

The Little Red School House was built in 1862. It was located on the northeast corner of Glendale-Milford and Reading Roads, where the Cultural Art Center is located today. It consisted of two classrooms, had an enrollment of 30 children and the only drinking fountain was outside. The first two teachers resigned so that they could join the Union Army during the Civil War.

The school quickly became the center of all types of activities for the residents. The Evendale Literary Society produced and performed plays, church services were held there, socials, picnics and suppers were common events in the building and on the school grounds. It has been reported that in 1941, a dance instructor came to school every Monday afternoon to teach the

interested students to tap dance. She had ten students in two classes.
