Dear Neighbors and Friends:

We continue to work on strategies to fight the pipeline going through Evendale. If the pipeline goes through Evendale as proposed, the entire north side of Glendale-Milford Road, from the municipal complex to Plainfield Road, will be affected. Recently we sent out surveys to all those residents, whose front yards will be dug up, asking them to document every tree in their front yard. We are receiving some great information from them. Our next step will be to take pictures of each property and match them with the surveys we receive. We have also enlisted the help of the Trossert family to give us information on the wildlife sanctuary they have created in the empty lots on Glendale-Milford Road. Finally, Dave Stark, one of our firemen, has flown the entire site with a drone taking pictures. This was a difficult task, but it may help.

The Residential Rental Property Registration Program was signed into law in February, 2017 and the time for compliance with the inspection phase has expired. Many rental owners have already registered and complied with the ordinance. We are off to a good start.

I hope you saw the article in the July 9th Enquirer about property values in Hamilton County. It shows that our residential property values are up 7% or greater. We do live in a fine community.

Stretching Tradition: New Quilts and Fiber Art Exhibit by the Queen City Quilters



Did you know...

With the resolve of Dave and Martha Carmody and the support of the Recreation Director at that time, Gene Martin, the Evendale swim team became a reality in 1980. It has taken many individuals who believed in that trio's original vision to continue the program and to develop it into such an integral part of the Evendale community. Gene Martin guided the team into the Northern Suburban Swim League, and it has remained in that league through today. Jim Jackson and Andy Utz were lifeguards at the Evendale pool at the time. They became our first coaches. We started out as the Evendale Eels, but quickly changed the name to Evendale Eagles.

The first team consisted of around 50 swimmers, about the same number of swimmers in our 6-and-Under group on this year's team. That year, the parents from the Springdale swim team came over and taught the Evendale parents how to run a swim meet. Parent involvement has always been crucial in making the Evendale Eagles a success. The Service Department made our first starting blocks, using house shingles on the top so the swimmers wouldn't slip. Ping pong paddles were converted into the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place paddles. Remarkably, there have been only two official starters in the entire history of the swim team. Dave Carmody was the first starter using a bull horn and starter pistol. Since Dave's retirement, Steve Berke has been starting the races.
