Dear Neighbors and Friends,

Joan and I would like to wish everyone peace, good will and happiness this holiday season.

Once again Evendale had a large number of residents who voted in the November election; approximately 83 percent of registered voters took the time to vote. I feel that this is an outstanding indicator of our residents being involved in the national and local issues. Evendale had six amendments to the Village Charter on the ballot, all of which passed.



The amendments result in:

- A title only change for two Village positions; from “Village Solicitor” to “Village Law Director” and “Administrative Assistant” to “Director of Administrative Services”.
- Raising the limitation on the Issuance of Bonds, without resident vote, from \$500,000 to \$5 million providing a funding option for larger capital investments such as fire trucks and roadway improvements that, in today’s market, often exceed \$500,000 in cost.
- The Charter Review Committee must now be appointed at least once every 10 years vs. 5 years.
- Council no longer has to declare vacant the seat of an elected officer who chooses to file nomination petitions for another elected position. For example, a councilmember no longer has to vacate their seat on Council in order to seek election as Mayor.
- Where an election is necessary to be held to fill one or two vacancies on Village Council, such election shall occur at the next general municipal election. Therefore, an elector appointed to an unexpired term of a vacated council seat must see re-election to that seat at the next general election after the vacancy is declared.

I believe these are all good changes. I want to thank the residents who voted for these amendments.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

The holiday season is one of the most dangerous times of the year for household fires. The US Fire Administration reports double the number of open-flame fires on Christmas Day than on an average day. Property damage caused by holiday fires are 34% greater and the number of fatalities per thousand household fires is nearly 70% higher.

- Cooking is the top cause of holiday fires. The most common offender is food that is left unattended.
- Candle fires are four times higher during December than other month. Maintain a safe distance between a candle and any flammable object.
- Live Christmas trees take less than 30 seconds to engulf a room in flames if it dries out. Make a fresh cut on the trunk prior to placing it in the stand and water every day.
- Decorative lights should be inspected annually and discarded if wires are cracked or frayed. Damaged wires are hot spots waiting to ignite.
- Fireplaces should be inspected and cleaned annually.

Did You Know...

Between the years 1948 – 1958 Evendale was the home of one of the most notable speedways in Cincinnati, called the Race Bowl. This ¼ mile high paved oval track was located at the south west corner of Reading and Glendale-Milford Roads. The Race Bowl's straightaways were banked 15 degrees and the turns at 34 degrees making it one of the fastest Race Tracks running at the time. All the country's Indy 500 drivers appeared at the Race Bowl in the 1950s, including A.J. Foyt, Eddie Sachs and Troy Ruttman. Midget cars ran during the week and Stock Cars primarily ran on Friday's and Saturday's.

ORD. #16-76 – Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 11-23 to extend boundaries of the Reading-Lockland-Arlington Heights-Evendale Enterprise Zone within the Village of Evendale and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary which relates either to the daily operation of the Village or the peace, health, safety or welfare of the Village.
