Dear Neighbors and Friends:

On behalf of all Village officials, please know that we sincerely care about the health and safety of our residents, businesses, patrons and employees as we work together through the CoronaVirus pandemic. Staff and I are monitoring the situation closely and we will comply with state/local/federal mandates which may require us to adjust our services, programing and policies. In keeping with these mandates and recommendations, our April 7th and 14th Council meetings will be live streamed for public view on Facebook, https://www.facebook.com/EvendaleOH/. No one will be permitted to attend these meetings in person. Facebook will allow your feedback to Council should you have questions, concerns, ideas, etc. This method of public meeting has been authorized by State Attorney General David Yost. We hope to resume "business as usual" soon; however, the medical experts are suggesting the pandemic will be through April.

Let me remind you that the Recreation and Cultural Arts Centers are closed until further notice. All other departments are open but continue to practice recommended social distancing and cleaning techniques. For a complete list of service adjustments, please visit our webpage and read the March 13th and March 19th Public Announcements. We will keep you posted if/when further mandates or recommendations are implemented.

The Stockyard Bank and Trust Co. is taking over the space where U.S. Bank was previously located on Glendale-Milford Road. One of their Officers and the Branch Manager attended our last Community Improvement Corp (CIC) meeting. They indicated they are very community oriented and want to participate in Village activities. They plan to open in mid-June.

The Village has signed a purchase agreement with Silco Fire Protection for the lot at the southwest corner of Reading Road and Inwood Drive. You have probably seen the stakes with orange flags at the site. Silco is an existing Evendale business currently located on Medallion Drive; however, they need more room due to company growth. Silco has been very good neighbors and we are glad to see them stay in our Village.

A couple of other events that occurred in the Village:

- You might have seen the Litter-Getter in the Millcreek waters by Menards. It collects trash as it comes
 downstream for the purpose of determining litter origin. This is a grant funded project by the non-profit,
 Millcreek Alliance
- Also, on Evendale Drive, our police found evidence of illegal dumping. They set up a camera and caught the
 perpetrators. Village officials will be seeking restitution for removal of all dumped trash and will soon be
 passing legislation to raise the current \$100.00 fine.

So keep your spirits up and we will get through these trying times. Maybe a good jigsaw puzzle would possibly be a family event; or, pick up and read a good book? Maybe a family walk each night after dinner? Me? I am working on my taxes rather than the usual last minute rush.

Greater Cincinnati Region Home Care Instructions for Patients with Mild Respiratory Infection

If you suspect you are sick with or have a confirmation you are sick with coronavirus disease (COVID-19)

You were evaluated by a professional and your symptoms were felt to be mild enough at this point that it is recommended that you self-isolate or quarantine at home. Most people with respiratory infections like colds, the flu, and Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) will have mild illness and can get better with appropriate home care and without the need to see a provider.

TREATMENT AND MEDICAL CARE

Treatment

There is no specific treatment for most viruses including those that that cause the common cold and those that cause COVID-19. Sometimes there is treatment for the viruses that cause influenza if given early.

Antibiotics treat infections caused by bacteria, but they do not work against viruses.

Most people recover on their own from these viruses, including COVID-19. Here are steps that you can take to help you get better:


- Rest
- Drink plenty of fluids
- Take over-the-counter cold and flu medications to reduce fever and pain. Follow the instructions on the package, unless your doctor gave you instructions. Note that these medicines do not "cure" the illness and therefore do not stop you from spreading germs.
- Children should not be given medication that contains aspirin (acetylsalicylic acid) because it can cause a rare but serious illness called Reye's syndrome. Children younger than age 2 should not be given any over-the-counter cold medications without first speaking with a doctor.

Seeking Medical Care

You should seek medical care if you are not getting better within a week, or if your symptoms get worse.

It is best to call ahead of time to discuss your symptoms, if possible. This may allow you to receive the advice you need by phone. By avoiding a visit to a healthcare facility, you protect yourself from getting a new infection and protect others from catching an infection from you. If you do visit a healthcare facility, put on a mask to protect other patients and staff.

It is recommended that you seek medical care or call 911 for serious symptoms, such as:



People with potentially life-threatening symptoms should call 911. **If possible, put on a facemask before emergency** medical services arrive.

PROTECTING OTHERS

Follow the steps below to help prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community.

Stay home when you are sick

- Stay home do not go to work, school, or public areas.
- Stay home for at least 24 hours after your symptoms have gone away without the use of fever-reducing medicines.
- If you must leave home while you are sick, try to avoid using public transportation, ride-shares, and taxis. Wear a mask if possible.

Separate yourself from other people and animals in your home

- Stay in a specific room and away from other people in your home as much aspossible.
- Use a separate bathroom, if available.
- Try to stay at least 6 feet from others.
- Do not handle pets or other animals while you are sick.

Avoid sharing personal household items

• Do not share dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, or bedding with other people or pets in your home. Wash them thoroughly with soap and water after use.

Clean your hands often

• Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol, covering all surfaces of your hands and rubbing them together until they feel dry. Use soap and water if your hands are visibly dirty.

Clean all "high-touch" surfaces every day

• High touch surfaces include counters, tabletops, doorknobs, bathroom fixtures, toilets, phones, keyboards, tablets, and bedside tables. Also, clean any surfaces that may have body fluids on them. Use a household cleaning spray or wipe, according to the product label instructions.

EVENDALE EMERGENCY SERVICES



Emergency Police and Fire Services: The Evendale Police and Fire Departments will continue to provide emergency services on a 24/7 basis. Please dial 911 in the event of an emergency.

Fire: Effective immediately, public access to Evendale Fire Department facilities is restricted to fire department staff and individuals with medical emergencies only. For non-emergency services please contact the Department via phone at 513-563-2248 or by email mhauck@evendaleohio.org.

EVENDALE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Administrative Services including Planning, Zoning, Building and Code Enforcement: The Administration Building will remain open during normal business hours, M-F 8am to 4pm but with limited access as follows: The building lobby is open and available to those who need to drop off or obtain information at the Administration window. Evendale Income Tax Department

The Village of Evendale Income Tax Department has suspended all in-person taxpayer assistance. The office is open and the Tax Administrator will be available to assist you by telephone and by email. In accordance with the Federal mandate announced on March 20, 2020, the due date for filing your tax return is now **JULY 15, 2020**. COVID-19 is likely to continue to have a significant impact on the 2020 tax season. Evendale will comply with any extensions of payment due dates and waivers of late payment fees and interest, as mandated by Federal and State Law. Any such changes will be posted on the Evendale Income Tax Department webpage of the Village of website https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department, and on social media.

If you have paperwork that you need to drop off in person, you may drop off the paperwork at the Administration front lobby window during normal business hours (8am-4pm) or in the **secure Tax Department drop-box** located in the lobby of the Police Department. The Police Department lobby is open 24/7.

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary

Keep Evendale green by recycling home electronics, household wastes and shredding of personal paper documents.





SERVICE DEPARTMENT

CHIPPER SERVICE: Residents are provided with a weekly curbside pickup of tree limbs and brush. It is available on Monday morning; please have tree limbs and brush at the curb by 7:00 a.m. Branches must be 10" or less in diameter, stacked neatly at the curb with stalk end street side. Twigs are considered yard waste, and should be placed in trash bins for pickup by Republic Services. If your driveway is located on a private drive, please call the Service Department to request chipper service. *NOTE*: Residents who hire contractors for limb and bush work are required to have contractors remove debris. The Village of Evendale will not remove debris created by contractors. Also, tree and brush debris from other areas may not be brought into the Village for removal.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION: Items such as vines, weeds, vegetable matter, garden waste, grass clippings, leaves and twigs are considered yard waste. Yard waste material should be placed in yard waste bags or placed in trash bins. Small piles of twigs should also be placed in trash bins and not left at the curb. When using a different container, please clearly mark it. These items will be picked up on your regular collection day by Rumpke
