Dear Neighbors and Friends:

This month I am writing you about two old issues that are once again making waves. The first is the matter of the City of Cincinnati Firing Range that is located in the Village across I-75. It very noisy; especially for those living in Lincoln Heights, Lockland and Woodlawn! Unfortunately, there is little that we can do about it. The firing range, owned and controlled by the City of Cincinnati, has been there since before the Village existed. We have persuaded them to shut it down each evening at 7pm and have offered to buy the property, but so far it has not been put up for sale. Frankly, they have no place to go.

The other vexing issue is the eighteen-wheelers travelling on Glendale-Milford Road between Reading and Plainfield Roads. When I took office, I had the Police Chief post a patrol car there with an overtime officer in the car. We caught a number of trucks during our six-month trial period. But it did not reduce the eighteen-wheeler traffic one iota. They paid their fine and went their merry way. Meanwhile, the overtime costs were eating us up.

The chief still has every shift spend one half-hour looking for trucks on this section of Glendale-Milford Road. But with our manpower, we are reluctant to do more. We have warning sign up in Blue Ash to warn the drivers before they pass the Plainfield intersection. It does little good. Some truckers tell us that the road is still designated as State Route 126 on their GPS systems. Some report that they have asked their trucking companies to make a GPS system change. If a truck from a trucking company is caught, we contact that company to advise that eighteen-wheelers are prohibited on Glendale-Milford Road. But it does not seem to be having any effect.

We are all ears if you have any ideas on either of these two issues. Please call if you would like to propose a solution!!

TAX DEPARTMENT

FILE BY April 17, 2018 The 2017 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return is due on or before April 17, 2018.

- SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER When preparing the Evendale Income Tax Return, please do not enter your complete SSN on the tax return.
- ATTACHMENTS REQUIRED The Federal Tax Return (Form 1040) must be attached to the Evendale Tax Return, along with all W-2's. (you may redact your SSN from these documents before attaching and mailing)
- TAX FORMS Tax Returns and additional tax information are available on our website www.evendaleohio.org. Forms may not be submitted electronically, however, a fillable pdf is available to assist with certain calculations.
- SIGN AND DATE The return must be signed and dated by the taxpayer. If filing a joint tax return, both taxpayers must sign and date the return.
- SECURE DROP BOX A secure drop box is available for the Tax Department and is located in the lobby of the Police Department. The Police Department lobby is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.


