These concerts will be different from their normal Cats performances in that they have deliberately chosen a smaller venue to allow more connection with the audience. Along with their full-length performance, there will also be an exclusive post-concert reception with the Cats, including snacks and drinks.

**Winter Safety Tips** 

# **Drive Safely in the Snow**

Driving in the winter means changes in the way you drive. Snow, sleet and ice can lead to hazardous road conditions. My Car Does What? is a campaign of the National Safety Council and the University of Iowa to Place dry, sterile gauze between toes and fingers help educate drivers on dozens of new vehicle safety technologies. But remember, you are your car's best safety feature. Take precautions to ensure you arrive • safely at your destination.

# **Avoid Strain while Shoveling**

Shoveling snow is a major winter activity in many parts of the United States. Taking a few precautions can help you prevent unnecessary pain and suffering. National Safety Council recommends the following tips to shovel safely.

- Do not shovel after eating or while smoking
- Take it slow and stretch out before you begin
- Shovel only fresh, powdery snow; it's lighter
- Push the snow rather than lifting it
- If you do lift it, use a small shovel or only partially fill the shovel
- Lift with your legs, not your back
- Do not work to the point of exhaustion

# **Treat Frostbite Immediately**

Use first aid to help someone who may have frostbite. If you suspect frostbite:

- Get indoors immediately
- Seek medical attention
- Remove constrictive clothing and jewelry that could impair circulation
- to absorb moisture and keep them from sticking together
- Elevate the affected area to reduce pain and swelling
- For superficial frostbite, you may also place the affected area in water that is 100 to 105 degrees until the tissue softens

# **Prevent Carbon Monoxide Poisoning**

Carbon monoxide detectors save lives, but less than one-third of American homes have one installed. With December and January at the peak of CO poisonings, be sure to follow tips like these:

- Replace the battery for your home's CO detector each spring and fall
- Do not heat your home with a gas range or oven
- Never run a car or truck inside an attached garage



# **SERVICE DEPARTMENT**



Snow and Ice - Our crews will salt and plow Village streets, beginning with primary routes and proceeding to residential streets. Please remove parked vehicles from Village streets when snow is predicted. We also ask that you do not shovel snow into the street as this may create a hazardous condition. Our goal is to keep all streets as clean as possible during snow emergencies.

# **POLICE DEPARTMENT**



In the coming months, the Police Department will again be directing our coyote management program. Areas within the Village selected for management will include, among others, the

Gorman Heritage Farm and Griffin Family Preserve. The specific areas within these two properties will be clearly posted with "Coyote Management Area" signs. It is important to note that the management practices utilized do not interfere with people visiting these properties. However, it is extremely important that visitors adhere strictly to two basic rules. Rule #1: All pets must be on a leash at all times and in complete control of their owner. Rule #2: Visitors must stay on designated paths within these properties. Do not venture off the commonly used paths, especially with pets. Otherwise, enjoy the properties to their fullest and direct any questions to Lt. Joe Asbrock at 563-2249.

- National Weather Service Watches and Warnings for Hamilton County
- Phone Call Alerts Available for: Civil Danger Warnings, Civil Emergency Messages, Evacuation Immediate Alerts, Flood Warnings, Flash Flood Warnings, Shelter in Place Warnings, and Tornado Warnings
- Critical Safety & Emergency Information
- Non-Emergency Messages from your Community

# How Can You Get These Alerts?

- Voice Call (Available for the following alerts: Flood Warning, Tornado Warning, Evacuation, Civil Danger Warning, Civil Emergency Message, Flash Flood Warning, Shelter in Place Warning)

# What is Smart911?

SMART911 allows first responders to have quicker access to important information in case of an emergency. By creating a profile, you provide first responders with key information about members of your household (names, physical descriptions, photos, pet information), as well as medical information. This information is crucial during an emergency.

# What Information Should I Include in My Profile?

- People Names, physical descriptions, and photos will help responders act quickly if a child goes missing, or help identify individuals in an emergency.
- Phones Add all phone numbers (especially cell phones) so that 9-1-1 will have a better idea where you are when you need help.
- Animals Include information about your pets and service animals that responders need to be aware of.
- Medical Information Existing conditions, allergies, disabilities and equipment, medications being taken by all members of your household.
- Address and Location Information Property details, photographs of your residence, utility shutoff locations, access points to the residence, floor layout and bedroom locations.
- Vehicle Information Include a description of your vehicle, as well as the license plate number.
- Emergency Contact Information Include the information of family members, friends, or neighbors in the event of an emergency.
- Communication Preferences If an individual is deaf or hard of hearing, or English is not the primary language, dispatchers will immediately know that an alternate form of communication is needed.


