Dear Neighbors and Friends:

Happy 4th of July!

When I became Mayor of Evendale in 2015, I initiated a meeting with GE Aviation, Evendale's largest employer and the world's largest manufacturer of jet engines. I was pleased to meet with the plant manager and several members of his team. I shared Evendale's AeroHub development plans and received positive thoughts and encouragement. Since that first meeting, I've had the pleasure of visiting GE on several occasions on a variety of topics. I continue to be impressed with GE's use of new technologies including 3-D printing. GE and AeroHub are an ideal complement. The improvement occurring on I-75 now, although difficult to endure at the moment, will literally pave the way for area growth and development. Hopefully in the near future, I'll be able to personally thank David Joyce, Vice Chair of GE and President/CEO for GE Aviation, for his outstanding leadership. We can discuss how AeroHub will further transform our region into a global advanced manufacturing powerhouse.

The tragic accident involving a little girl on Cooper Road has brought that street to our attention. Too many drivers are travelling too fast on this residential road. We have installed new signs indicating strict enforcement of the 25 mph speed limit and I have instructed the police department to aggressively enforce speeding violations.

In June, Council approved the ordinance to accept the bid for the construction of the new AeroHub Boulevard. This means that the current light at St. Rita's Lane will be moved to the west so that it will line up with the current Landmark entrance, which will become AeroHub Boulevard. We figured with all the construction going on at the interchange, what difference would a little move make. This construction must be completed by the end of 2018 in order for us to receive our \$500,000 grant from Job Ohio.

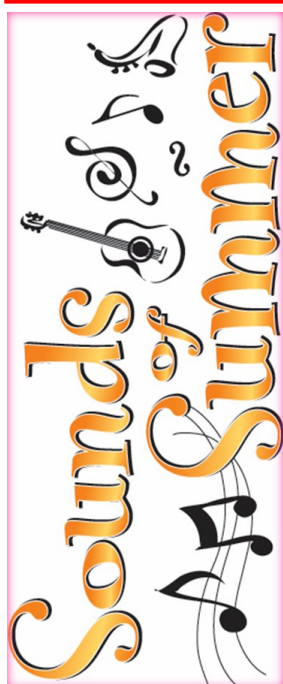

ADOPTED ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

The following ordinances were adopted by Council at their Special Council Meeting on June 4, 2018 and their Regular Council Meeting on June 12, 2018. Ord. #18-32 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to **enter into a contract with Kelchner, Inc. accepting its bid, as modified herein, for the construction of AeroHub Boulevard Phase I Roadway**, appropriating the funds for the project and declaring an emergency. Approved

Ord. #18-34 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to **enter into an agreement with Anthem to provide a comprehensive health insurance benefit** to full time Village employees and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-35 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to **enter into an agreement with Ohio Plan Risk Management, Inc. to provide property and liability Insurance** with the assistance of Hylant Administrative Services for the Village of Evendale and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-37 – Ordinance authorizing the **Police Chief to enter into a lease agreement with the Board of County Commissioners, Hamilton County, Ohio for the use of Clear Funded Mobile Data Computers and Docking Stations** and declaring an emergency Approved

Ord. #18-38 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to **enter into a purchase agreement with Dennis Schnurr, the Archbishop of Cincinnati, Trustee, to acquire 0.712 acres of land currently a part of the St. Rita's School campus** and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved


Ord. #18-39 – Ordinance **appointing Nick Young to the Cultural Arts Commission** for a term ending December 31, 2018 and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-40 – Ordinance **approving Water Management and Sedimentation Control plans for Evendale Industrial LLC** and authorizing Building Commissioner to issue permit and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary .

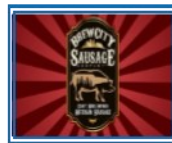
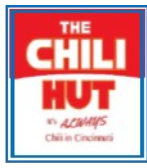



Did You Know...

That the first Evendale 10K run was in 1982, with the walking portion added in 1993. Last year we had approximately 231 runners and walkers. Chip timing was added to the event in 2016. This event is now a USAFT-certified course. To be certified the course distance had to be verified for accuracy. This allows the runners' times can be accepted as a record or allows the runners to be nationally ranked.

After the race the participants consume 2 cases of grapes, ½ case of apples, ½ case of oranges, 4 watermelons, 4 ½ gallons of orange juice, 12 dozen bagels and 2 cases of bananas.

The logo for the race had been the same up to 1996. It was a circular design printed on a pastel colored shirt. In 1996, the design started changing every year and the colors are always patriotic.
