Dear Neighbors and Friends:

This month I'm going to talk about coyotes and their dangers. Remember, we are seeking input from you on how to handle the large population of coyotes we have in Evendale.

Coyotes can range in color from tan to grey and black. They are active from dusk to dawn. Their typical diet consists of mice, deer, moles, rabbits, raccoons, fruit and goose eggs. On occasion they have been attracted to bird feeders, not for the bird seed but for the animals that gather under the bird feeders to feed.

The following are suggestions in dealing with coyotes:

Don't approach a coyotes or linger to snap a picture or video.

Don't turn your back on coyotes or run from them. This may trigger their chase instinct.

Don't harass a coyotes if it is cornered or with their pups. Back away slowly and make loud noises. Make yourself bigger by waving your arms. Never throw a stick or rock directly at them but off to the side.

Teach your children to recognize a coyote.

Keep your eye on small children and dogs when in your yard.

Coyotes usually build their dens in a hollow tree or brush pile. Never approach a den or where you think there might be a den.

Another interesting fact that I have learned is that coyotes don't like mules. So the Gorman Heritage Farm may be the safest place from coyotes in Evendale.

SERVICE DEPARTMENT

THRU THE VALLEY – INTERSTATE 75 IMPROVEMENTS

The Ohio Department of Transportation has awarded the contract for Phase 1 of the Thru the Valley Project -Interstate 75 Improvements to the John R Jurgensen Co. This project will involve the reconstruction I-75 from north of Glendale Milford Road to South of Shepherd Lane. The scope of the project will be to eliminate the access lanes and add a fourth lane to the main interstate. In addition, drainage, bridge work, new and improvement interchanges are part of the project.

It is anticipated that the construction will begin in June of 2017 and will be completed by June of 2020. The construction is substantial and will affect traffic patterns. ODOT and the Village of Evendale will be issuing traffic updates on websites and on Social Media.

REPUBLIC SERVICES – TRASH AND RECYCLING

In order to provide a more efficient trash/recycling collection, there will be some adjustments on what day your trash and recycling is collected. This will affect around 200 households and will mainly involve collection for the following streets: Wyscarver, Margate Terrace, Glendale Milford, Boxwood, Oak, Plainfield, Woodleigh, Reading, and portions of Sherbrooke and Vinevard. This change will occur in June and affected households will receive both a mailing and cart hanger to assist in the transition. 
