



# **VILLAGE OF EVENDALE**

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

The new advanced wireless system, 5G, is coming to our Village sooner rather than later. It is supposed to be 100 times faster than our current 4G System. Verizon has said that our area is the focus of a dream area for the first 5G System. This new system doesn't come without problems.

In last month's newsletter, our Village Engineer provided a brief introduction to what is happening. He mentioned that we have already received at least three applications for underground wiring and that the installation of poles will follow.

This new system will have poles 50 feet high and perhaps as close as 100 feet apart. The wiring will be underground but the poles will be placed in the right of way. Duke will not permit the equipment to be their poles so new poles will dot the landscape. I am told that each carrier will have their own pole. It will potentially create a Beechmont Avenue scenario.

You might ask, "Why isn't Evendale passing an ordinance regulating the location of the poles?". Unfortunately, the Federal Communication Commission has already ruled that neither the state nor the local communities have any power to regulate the 5G System. They have usurped all rights of local governments. So you may see poles being installed anywhere in the Village's right of way.

There are other reasons to fear this new 5G System. In a recent New York Times article, they reported that serious, serious security concerns is a potential problem. Surveillance threats will increase on all of us. Some of these can come from foreign countries.

What can we do? When the carriers come knocking at your door, mention these points. The carriers are afraid that customers will not use the new service. If enough residents rebel, then the poles will be for naught.

On another note, I recently attended a luncheon about the economic impact of Cincinnati State Technical and Community College to the area. While they have multiple locations, they still are a factor in the economic stability of Evendale. In 2015-16, they added \$657.2 million in revenue to the region. Their operating spending totaled \$75 million during that same time period. Again, the benefits do not accrue only to Evendale, but a part does help our community. We need to be aware of this in future planning.

### Summertime Burn Safety

- Wear short sleeves or roll them up when cooking on the grill.

- Keep a 3-foot safe zone around grills, fire pits and campfires.
- Attend public fireworks displays; leave the lighting to the professionals.

### First aid for burns:

- Place the burn in cool water for three to five minutes.
- Cover the burn with a clean, dry cloth.
- See your doctor if the burn is larger than the size of your palm.



### **DID YOU KNOW...**

The Village of Evendale recently sold 1.4 acres of vacant land at the northeast corner of Reading Road and Inwood Drive to SWE Evendale LLC to construct a 3,500 sq. ft. stand-alone retail paint store. Site preparation has commenced. "We are delighted to open a new store Evendale" said Josh Roedemeier of SWE. "Sherwin Williams is a nationally recognized retailer who will make a nice addition to our retail corridor" noted Mayor Finan. Evendale originally purchased the land in the early 2000's and demolished a dilapidated auto service facility and house.

Sherwin Williams approached Evendale in September 2017. "The site is challenging to redevelop given its former use and steep topography" said David Elmer, Evendale's Director of Administrative Services. "Although it took some time to reach an agreement on a final plan, SWE representatives were great to work with" Elmer continued.

The property was purchased for \$270,000 with a portion of the proceeds funding construction of a small boulevard island on Inwood Drive to buffer between commercial and residential.
