Dear Neighbors and Friends:

Let's talk this month about the Millcreek Valley Conservancy District (MVCD). The organization has recently been in the news and I expect that will continue. It is especially topical now because of the recent rains and flooding.

MVCS was formed by eight communities, including Evendale, after the disastrous Millcreek flood in 1959. The Ohio Revised Code Chapter 6101 established numerous conservatory districts throughout Ohio. You may have heard of the one in Dayton which operates there in a similar manner. The MVCD board is made up of three unpaid members with no professional support staff. Their decisions are over seen by the Hamilton County Common Pleas judge per ORC Chapter 6101.

The MVCD has not really functioned as it was envisioned. It has stayed in existence only by resources provided by local, state and federal agencies. The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers has shouldered the majority of the finances through federal grants. They have maintained the Millcreek with flood control measures and channeling, as evident along I-75 near the St. Bernard exit.

Now, however, that is changing. According to a recently signed agreement, the U.S. Corp of Engineer will be pulling out of their role by 2020. At that time the MVCD must assume responsibility for the maintenance of the Millcreek. That is where it gets interesting. By law, MVCD can go to the Common Pleas judge and ask for a real estate property tax to be assessed on land within the District. You, as voters, will not have a voice in this matter.

This approach would not be unusual. The Hamilton Court Storm Water District assess such a tax on Evendale now. But you never see it because the Village pays it in its entirety. If a new tax is assessed, that tax will likely exceed our Village resources and therefore cause your property tax rates to increase.

Village flooding from the Millcreek does occur, but mainly in the commercial areas. Reading has seen problems in its residential area west of Reading Road.

I think it is important to keep the MVCD in business. Otherwise it's going to be every community trying to solve its own problem. This would be ineffective and would not work for a stream like the Millcreek. Corrective actions are usually required upstream of where the problems are experienced.

As an aside, I have had the opportunity to paddle the Millcreek through Sharonville, Evendale and Reading. I was amazed at the many beautiful spots along the creek.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Department has been tasked with managing, to the extent possible, the coyote population in the Village. In doing so, the Department utilizes small areas of Village-owned land either unsuitable for public activities or otherwise restricted from public access. Clear, distinguishable signs are erected advising persons of the location where activities are taking place.

For your safety, please do not enter restricted areas. Also, please keep dogs leashed, in accordance with Village ordinance, and keep all pets out of restricted areas.

Thank you for adhering to posted signs. Please contact the Police Department with any questions.



## FIRE DEPARTMENT

The fire department often answers the question "why do so many vehicles show up on just a medical emergency?" The infographic shows why we send a team to give a patient the best possible treatment we can provide. We certainly hope that sharing this information helps explain why you see the amount of vehicles and people responding.

1. Captain/Paramedic: consoles loved ones, gather facts from witnesses, obtains pertinent patient medical history from family members, finds patient's prescriptions medications, explains what is going on to family members, overall scene management and crowd control if necessary.
2. Firefighter/Paramedic; In charge of patient care, delegates assignments to crew members, attaches patient to defibrillator, interpret EKG reading, when indicated administers electrical shock via the defibrillator, obtains patients vital signs.
3. Firefighter/Paramedic: Contacts base hospital, obtains medical direction from base hospital physician, documents patient care being administered, completes patient care report from which is vital during transferring of care to emergency room, drives the ambulance.



4. Firefighter/Paramedic: Maintains patient airway, provides supplemental oxygen via bag valve mask, provides pressure ventilation which is crucial from vital organ survivability, preps and performs intubation to establish an advanced airway.
5. Firefighter/Paramedic: Provides continuous chest compressions at a rate of 100 compressions per minutes. Compressions must be uninterrupted to ensue brain and tissue perfusion.
6. Firefighter/Paramedic: Establishes intravenous access through an intraosseous cannulation. Maintains a patient IV line. Checks blood sugar levels which is critical in diabetic patients. Administers lifesaving cardiogenic medications which can potentially restart the heart.

**FILE BY April 15, 2019** The 2018 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return is due on or before April 15, 2019.

**SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER** When preparing the Evendale Income Tax Return, please do not enter your complete SSN on the tax return.

**ATTACHMENTS REQUIRED** The 2018 Federal Tax Return (Form 1040, pages 1, 2, and Schedule 1) must be attached to the Evendale Tax Return, along with all W-2's and other applicable schedules (the SSN may be redacted from these documents before mailing)

**TAX FORMS** Tax Returns and additional tax information are available on our website [www.evendaleohio.org](http://www.evendaleohio.org). A fillable pdf is available to assist with certain calculations.

**SIGN AND DATE** The return must be signed and dated by the taxpayer(s).

**SECURE DROP BOX** A secure drop box is available for the Tax Department and is located in the lobby of the Police Department. The Police Department lobby is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

## **ADOPTED ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS**

**Res. #19-01** – Resolution endorsing and approving the Bank Barn Preservation Project at the Gorman Heritage Farm.

**Ord. #18-87** – Ordinance approving the Declaration of Covenants and Restriction and Reservation of Easements for “AeroHub South” and declaring an emergency.

**Ord. #19-06** – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to hire Tamara Prophater as the Seasonal Part-Time Tennis Pro for the Recreation Department and declaring an emergency

**Ord. #19-07** – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to hire Daphina (Elaine) Beuerlein as a Part-Time Clerk for the Recreation Department and declaring an emergency.

**Ord. #19-08** – Ordinance completing the consolidation of Chapter 260, “Part-time, Seasonal and Temporary Employees Generally” of the Evendale Codified Ordinance into Chapter 258, “Employees Generally”, repealing said Chapter 260 and declaring an emergency.

**Ord. #19-09** – Ordinance authoring the Police Chief to execute an amended and restated Mutual Aid Agreement for Law Enforcement and declaring an emergency.

**Ord. #19-10** – Ordinance approving a transfer from the Contingency Fund to the Recreation Department and declaring an emergency.

**Ord. #19-11** – Ordinance authorizing the payment of amounts due upon certain contract requiring certification of Availability of Funds and declaring an emergency.

**Res. #19-02** – Resolution to correct a typographical error on Exhibit “A” of Ordinance #18-43 and as also contained in the School Compensation Agreements between Princeton City Schools and Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development.

**Res. #19-03** – Resolution supporting the Mill Creek Restoration Project and authorizing the Mayor to submit an application for Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) Clean Ohio Funds Green Space Conservation Program through the Natural Resources Assistance Council.


