Duke Energy continues to move forward on their proposed gas pipeline. They have filed an application with the Ohio Power Siting Board. Even though we are still the alternate route, we have joined this fight with the City of Cincinnati, Hamilton County, Blue Ash, Madeira, Sycamore Township and others to stop the pipeline. An application has been filed to intervene in Duke's application. Our application gives us a voice at the state level. I don't see this pipeline becoming a reality for several years, but we want to stay ahead of the game. I'm afraid even the possibility of the pipeline coming through Evendale, may have already cost the Village a business.

Another problem facing our residents is coyotes. They are growing in numbers and becoming much bolder. Several attacks on dogs have been reported. One attack occurred as the owner watched from her window; and this was a pretty big dog! The question is, "Should we make an effort to reduce the number of coyotes?" If you have an opinion on this, please let us know. This issue will be in front of Council in the near future.

Finally, work on the Tribute Tower continues. If you have been on the Village grounds, perhaps you have seen activity at the Baxter Park entrance. The deadline for having the bronze plaques and bricks installed in time for the dedication over Memorial Day weekend has passed. You can still purchase plaques for veterans, firemen, or police offices and bricks for your family. The purpose of the memorial is to honor our veterans and first responders for generations to come.


