Dear Neighbors and Friends:

In April, the State of Ohio passed a bill which calls for an increase in the gasoline tax of 10.7 cents per gallon. No tax pleases people, but most agree that this one was necessary to keep our roads in good shape. Overall gas tax revenues had been declining because of better gas mileage on new cars and the increased use of electric and hybrid cars. As a byproduct of the bill, the Village will get an increase in its allocation of road funds from the state. On July 1st, we will go from an estimated allocation of \$260,618 per year to an estimated allocation of \$423,597 per year. We will have that increase to fix our roads. This bill also calls for an annual charge on electric cars.

Speaking of tax increases, the fees the Village pays to the Hamilton County Board of Health are going up for 2019 by \$13,860. We currently pay \$212,059 per year. These fees are paid by the village, not the residents. These fees cover many health events such as inspection of restaurants and swimming pools. Incidentally, the Board of Health is celebrating its 100th Anniversary.

On the plus side, we received \$68,000 from the remainder in the Griffin Trust Fund. Robert Griffin, a longtime resident and benefactor to the Village, passed away earlier this year. He served on the very first Village Council and donated the land that we now know as Griffin Park. Mr. Griffin named The Village of Evendale as a beneficiary of his estate along with five other organizations.

We have created a committee to study the rising cost of health insurance premiums. We have been advised that our premiums for Village employees will go up next year by 15% to 20%.

As you can see from the items above, the municipal finances are complicated and very fluid. I want to reassure you that Council and myself take our finances seriously and try to be good stewards of your money.

In closing, I want to remind you of the upcoming celebration of the 60th Anniversary of the Evendale Fire Department. They have planned a day full of fun to celebrate this anniversary on Memorial Day, May 27th. I hope you have an opportunity join the Fire Department staff in this celebration and show your support. Please come on down!!

ADOPTED ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

The following ordinances were adopted by Council at their Regular Council Meeting on April 9, 2019. The complete ordinance and support information are available at the Administration Office. If you would like to view this information or if you have any questions, please contact our Village Clerk, Barb Rohs, at 563-2244.

Ord. #19-15 – Ordinance amending the Village of Evendale Planning and Zoning Code, Section 1256.19 amending the text to the Innovation District PUD regulations and declaring an emergency.

Ord. #19-16 – Ordinance approving a transfer from the Contingency Fund to the Police Department Capital Improvements Account and declaring an emergency.

Ord #19-17 – Ordinance authorizing the payment of amounts due upon certain contracts requiring certification of availability of funds and declaring an emergency.

Ord. #19-18 – Ordinance adopting a new subsection to Ordinance 258.241 “Drug and Alcohol Testing” in order to clearly state the Evendale policy prohibiting the use of medical marijuana by village employees and declaring an emergency.

Ord #19-19 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Constellation New Energy Services to establish and three year fixed gas supply rate and declaring an emergency.

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary.



SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The various Rumpke trash dumpsters on the municipal complex are for village use and facility rentals only. The Village of Evendale provides special pickups for items at the curb that need to be disposed of and the dump truck service that residents may take advantage of. These services are explained on the Village website, or by calling the Service Department at 513-563-4338.

The Village has received several applications to install underground fiber cables within the community for the proposed 5G cellular service. These applications are for just the underground work at this time and will be installed over the next few months. This work is a precursor to the installation of stand-alone mini towers. The Federal Communication Commission (FCC) has ruled that this service may be installed within the public right of way and the local communities are unable to prevent these installations. So far we have received applications for the Sharondale and Glendale Milford Roads areas within the residential zoning district. FIRE DEPARTMENT

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries.

Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup on the grills and in trays below the grill.



- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal starter fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals cool completely before disposing in a metal container.

AED'S -

Automated External Defibrillator

The Recreation Center is now equipped with three AED's (automated external defibrillator,) that are all accessible to the public. They are located near the Lobby at the North Entrance, the South Entrance and inside the Fitness Center by the desk. There will also be one at Pool in the Manager's Office. The three cabinets at the Recreation Center that hold the AED's are alarmed, and 911 will be called when the door is opened.

AED's are used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. The device's visual and audio prompts help to guide the rescuer through each stage and alleviate any worry that steps are being missed. The AED's also help the rescuer avoid the most common mistakes made during CPR—inadequate chest compression depth and rate.

SwimSafe Lesson Program Levels

Level 0: Frogs & Tadpoles

Prerequisite - Child must be 9-36 months old.

Focus - Parent/Child Water Acclimation, Safety.

Taught by a certified professional, parent (or responsible adult) and child will become acclimated to the water through games and songs while in a group setting. Parent will learn key safety tools to use at a pool or near water.

Parent and child are welcome to participate in this class until the child is 3-years-old and comfortable moving to the Flounder class on their own.

Skills - Water safety, proper use of flotation devices, water acclimation, movement through water, floating in the water, blowing bubbles, and more.

Requirements -

A parent (or responsible adult) is required to participate in the water with each child.

All children must wear a swim diaper. Registration is limited to one class per session per child.

Level 1: Flounder Skills

Prerequisites - Child must be at least 3-years-old and willing to participate in class without a parent.

Focus - Water Acclimation, Submersion, Air Exchange.

Child will become acclimated to the water through games and will learn basic safety skills in addition to water submersion and floating with support.

Skills - Independent movement through the water, floating on front and back, recovery from a floating position, nose/mouth bubbles, introduction to bobs, and age-appropriate safety skills.

Requirements -

Any child not potty-trained must wear a swim diaper.

Parent (or responsible adult) must remain on pool deck during lessons.

Registration is limited to one class per child per session.

Level 2: Jellyfish Skills

Prerequisite - Successful completion of Flounder skills.

Focus - Body Position, Forward Momentum.

Child will expand on the skills learned in the Flounder class and learn to be in the water unassisted in both front and back positions while learning to propel themselves through the water using either arms or legs.

Skills - Floating, gliding, streamline body position, recovery, bobs, submersion, propulsive kicking,

introduction to propulsive arms, sit dives, and safety skills.

Requirements -

Swimmers must wear proper swim attire.

Parent (or responsible adult) must remain on pool deck during lessons.

Registration is limited to one class per child per session.

Level 3: Octopus Skills

Prerequisite - Successful completion of Jellyfish skills.

Focus - Coordination, Strong Flutter Kick, Introduction to Competitive Kicks.

Child will learn fundamental freestyle and backstroke skills with emphasis placed on the coordination and timing of the strokes as well as the development of a strong flutter kick.

Skills - Novice freestyle, novice backstroke, elementary backstroke, side glide, treading, kneel dive, and safety skills.

Requirements -

Swimmers must wear proper swim attire.

Parent (or responsible adult) must remain on pool deck during lessons.

Registration is limited to one class per child per session.

Swim goggles (not a snorkel or mask) may be used by children in levels 3 and above.

Correction - Please contact the Pool Manager or a Lifeguard when the pool opens to set-up private swim lessons for levels beyond Octopus or private lessons in general.
