

Did You Know...

Evendale's first school was built in 1840. It was a small brick building located on east side of Reading Road approximately 800 feet south of Glendale-Milford Road. Tuition was one cent per day. A new, two-room Red Brick School Building was built in 1862 at the corner of Reading and Glendale-Milford Roads, current location of the Cultural Arts Building. This building was the center for many activities including civic, social, religious and educational meetings, plays, picnics, socials and suppers. The community pride in their school enabled the small, rural Evendale population to defeat annexation attempts by some adjoining municipalities. The Cultural Arts Building was built in 1932 and served

as the primary grade school for Princeton City Schools until the early 1960's. Eventually the Village bought the building back in the 1970's.

ORD. #16-67 – Ordinance approving an appropriation for capital items in the Fire Department and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

ORD. #16-68 – Ordinance approving Water Management and Sedimentation Control plans for Dynamic Sight Properties, Ltd. and authoring the Building Commissioner to issue permit and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

RES. #16-04 – Resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor. Unanimously Approved

RES. #16-05 – Resolution approving the official seal of the Village of Evendale. Unanimously Approved

An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary which relates either to the daily operation of the Village or the peace, health, safety or welfare of the Village.
