Dear Neighbors and Friends:

Many residents from the Park Hills Subdivision have asked about the construction occurring along the streets in their neighborhood. When I contacted Duke Energy, I was informed that Duke is doing what they call an "Underground Reconductor" job. Apparently, the wiring that was installed over thirty years ago has deteriorated. Duke is replacing all the wire on those circuits. This will provide better service to the Duke customers and lessen failures. This job is very large and I am certain that it feels like they have been in Park Hills forever. But I am told that they will be finished very shortly. They will be required to restore all impacted yards and landscaping.

Now on another note, there has been some utility work done on our private drive that is totally unrelated to what has been happening in Park Hills. That construction project was a result of a gas leak in the twenty-inch transmission line that comes out of Warren County and goes to the City of Cincinnati. Duke first tried a temporary fix by wrapping the pipe with a special tape. They had to return several months later to replace 150 feet of the pipe. That lead to Duke having to dig through our private drive. Within the past week or so we got our drive restored. I can now get my car washed again!!!

I would like to wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving. This holiday gives us a great opportunity to get families together.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

We are proud to announce that the fire department has been awarded two grants in the past several months! The Ohio BWC awarded us a grant for just under \$15,000 for a new extractor (big washing machine), barrier hoods and fire gloves. The new extractor will only be used to wash our fire-fighting gear so as not to drag any contaminants into the living area of the building.



The second grant will be used to replace our current vehicle exhaust system, which was installed in 1997. This system has served the department well, however we can no longer find replacement parts or a company which chooses to service it. With this system we connect exhaust hoses to all of the emergency apparatus's tail pipes with magnets. The other end of the hose is connected to an exhaust fan on the roof. Upon starting the engines, the exhaust fumes are sucked out of the building through the exhaust fan. As the vehicles pull out the garage, the hoses slide down a track near the ceiling and eventually are automatically pulled off the tail pipes. The new system has newer technology and is serviceable. We look forward to having this new system installed by second quarter of 2019. This grant is for \$77,000 and the village's portion is 5% of that cost.

Facts about home heating fires

- From 2013-2015, an average of 45,900 home heating fires occurred in the United States each year. These fires caused an annual average of approximately 205 deaths, 725 injuries and \$506 million in property loss.
- Cooking fires are the first leading cause of home fires with heating fires the second.
- Home heating fires peaked in the early evening hours between 5 and 9 p.m. with the highest peak between 6 and 8 p.m. This four-hour period accounted for 29 percent of all home heating fires.
- Home heating fires peaked in January (21 percent) and declined to the lowest point from June to August.
- Confined fires — fires confined to chimneys, flues or fuel burners — accounted for 75 percent of home heating fires.
- Twenty-nine percent of the non-confined home heating fires — fires that spread past the object of origin — happened because the heat source (like a space heater or fire place) was too close to things that can burn.

ADOPTED ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

The following ordinances were adopted by Council at their Regular Council Meeting on October 9, 2018. The complete ordinance and support information are available at the Administration Office. Ord. #18-66 – Ordinance authorizing the payment of amounts due upon certain contracts requiring certification of availability of funds and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-67 – Ordinance approving an appropriation for additional costs related to the Phi Lambda Pi service organization and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-68 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to grant an access easement across Lot 23 of the Evendale Heights Subdivision and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Ord. #18-69 – Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Constellation New Energy Services to provide natural gas aggregation preparatory services and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

Res. #18-07 – Resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor. Unanimously Approved

Res. #18-08 – Resolution adopting the 2018 Hamilton County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. Unanimously Approved

Res. #18-09 – Resolution consenting to the execution of an agreement between the board of County Commissioners of Hamilton County, Ohio and the Modal Shop Inc. providing for the adoption of a project which will expand a business in the Village of Evendale and create and/or preserve employment opportunities within an enterprise zone of Hamilton County and declaring an emergency. Unanimously Approved

An Emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary

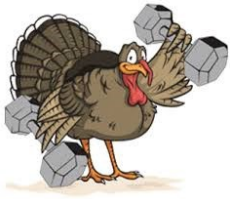
