Dear Neighbors and Friends:

This month I want to bring you up to date on the lawsuits that the Village faces.

First, there is the Rural Metro that began years ago. Rural Metro had applied for a permit to change one of their buildings on Medallion Drive to a holding center for illegal immigrants. There are many twists and turns to this case but the essential claim was that our Director of Administrative Services and our Building Commissioner interfered with their project. The Village won at the trial court level; that decision was appealed. Just recently we were advised that the Appeals Court upheld the findings of the trial court. They are entitled to appeal once more to the Ohio Supreme Court. Our solicitor doubts that they will take this case any further.

Next is the latest on the Duke Pipeline case which is before the Ohio Power Siting Board (OPSB). The issue is whether the 20 inch gas main should be built in Evendale. A continuance for the September 11th meeting was granted by the OPSB. Duke had requested the postponement so they further examine a property located in Reading on which environmental remediation has occurred. The staff of the OPSB has already determined that Duke has met the requirement to show need for the pipeline. We continue to monitor this and work toward a better solution than placing the gas main in Evendale.

Lastly, we have the case of Harold Vonderhaar, Michael Lemen, Stiney Investment I, Ltd. et al vs the Village of Evendale, David Elmer and Don Mercer. This case has been recently filed in the Federal District Court before Judge Barrett. The plaintiffs claim our new Property Maintenance Code, by which the Village seeks to maintain the standards of our Village as a great place to live, is unconstitutional. Mr. Vonderhaar owns sixteen rental properties in Evendale. Preliminary hearings before the judge will occur soon. Depositions have already occurred with Harold Vonderhaar, David Elmer and Don Mercer. These depositions took seven hours. Time will tell about the constitutionality. Meanwhile, we cannot enforce violations on these properties.

Time Changes Mean Battery Changes - Get in the habit of changing the batteries in your smoke

detectors and carbon monoxide detectors every fall and spring when changing the clocks for Daylight Savings Time. It is also a good idea to make it standard procedure in your household to verify that all fire extinguishers are fully charged and in working order when you adjust the clocks each season. Finally, check the manufacture dates on all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. If they are greater than 10 years old, replace them. Their elements lose the ability to detect smoke and carbon monoxide hazards as they age.

Home Heating Tip - No matter what type of device you use to heat your home, make sure your heating devices and/or systems are in good working order. Many things can go wrong with your heating equipment during the spring and summer months. Take time now to verify that everything you need to keep your home warm throughout fall and winter is in good working order before we experience the first cold snap of the season.



An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary
