Dear Neighbors and Friends:

In reflecting on the events that have been dominating the news headlines for the past several months, I think it is time to rebuild our Fire/Police/Veteran's Memorial. Our first memorial consisted of seven plaques, recognizing fire, police and the various branches of our armed services, which were displayed in front of the old Fire and Police building. With the development of our current campus, those plaques were moved to the grassy area between the Fire and Recreation buildings. The current memorial is very inconspicuous and its existence is not known among most of our residents.

My thought is to build a more suitable and inviting memorial for these plaques at the entrance to Baxter Park. I would like to incorporate a Liberty Bell in this memorial since one of the only bell foundries in the world, Verdin Bell Company is located right here in Cincinnati.

Ten thousand dollars has already been pledged to this project if it goes forward. While the Village could fund this project, I believe it would be more meaningful if our residents contributed. One idea that I have for additional funds is by implementing a program where by Residents could purchase bricks engraved with their names; similar to the bricks that are in the original Shelter House.

What do you think of the idea for this Fire/Police/Veteran's Memorial? I am anxious to hear from you.

June and Deacon Francis Wagner have been Evendale residents for 27 years. In July, they competed in the two-day Ohio Senior Olympic Games near Columbus. June had four first place finishes in swimming, including the 200 IM, plus a third place finish in the

javelin toss. Francis got a second and a third in his swimming endeavors. The first four finishers qualify to compete in next year's 2017 Senior Games at the University of Alabama. Last year, the Wagners swam at the Senior Games held at the University of Minnesota where June medaled. "We love our Evendale Rec Center and pool. The facilities help us to stay healthy and competitive year round."

For almost ten years, June has been an instructor for neighboring Boy Scout troops, helping young lads attain their religious emblem award, teaching them both civic and moral responsibility. Deacon Francis was ordained in 2001 for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. For the past 14 years he has served the Archbishop as his Master of Ceremonies. This fall Francis will be helping his team defend their title at the annual Village of Evendale Men's Golf Outing.

ADMINISTRATION DEPARMENT

The Zika virus has prompted concern on the part of public health officials at all levels.

There is no vaccine for Zika, so the best treatment that we have is prevention. Public education is paramount. CDC had adopted a three step defense approach: Dress properly – wear tighter weaves that mosquitoes can't bite through; Drain Containers – remove standing water where mosquitoes could lay eggs, such as buckets, planters/plant saucers, toys, birdbaths and trash containers; Use Repellants – several suggested brand names are DEET, Sawyer, Skin So Soft Bug Guard Plus Expedition.



An emergency clause is frequently added to an ordinance in order to allow the ordinance or resolution to go into effect immediately upon adoption. Under Evendale's Charter the emergency provision must be separately voted on and approved by no less than 5 members of Council. It must include a reason for why it is necessary which relates either to the daily operation of the Village or the peace, health, safety or welfare of the Village.
