#### 1. Recreation

- a. Ordinance for the hiring of Mary Carole Schneider, Childcare Attendant- this position takes the place of someone moving to full time at another location. These part time employees fill a need.
- b. Ben Seabum just put in his notice and will be retained as a sub.
- c. 2019-2020 Fitness Center RFP- ordinance- Lifetime Essential will have the contract for 2yrs for \$86,868. This will include incentive prizes such as t-shirts. The rec center does the group exercise class. Average class size, per week, is 92 and one year ago it was 36.
- d. WeThrive team has grown to include Susan Gordy, GHF Tricia Watts, Kristen Maiden and Niel Korte. A new resolution will be on the agenda. VOE has the highest ranking of any municipalities in Hamilton County.
- e. Steve Berke will be honored at the VOE Light Up.
- f. Halloween Fest went well. 723 registered.

a. Update- Lot of corner of Cooper/Mohler- needs to be cleaned up. Also the PNC bank lot maintenance and lot next to CAM's market.

- a. Photography show was a big success. 155 entries and 75-80 displayed.
- b. Programs such as "Young Rembrandts" and wine tasting continue.

Service/Engineering

- a. Traffic island ord. Jeffery Allen was the only bidder and will continue with the installation of plantings and maintenance. Slight increase. VOE is applying for a \$10,000 grant for Griffin Farm area. The entrance area to Walmart is supposed to be maintained by Menards. Mr. Elmer will contact the Evendale Commons developer.
- b. Waste collection ord. Rumpke is the low bidder of about \$30,000 per year. There will be some coordination with collection of garbage and trash cans.
- c. Vacation plat ord. This will be on a future meeting because it needs to be advertised.
- d. Dump truck discussion- Wait time for a truck is approx. 14 months. Dual truck setup will be required because of Glendale Milford. There will be an ordinance for the ordering of a truck and there are funds available in some lines. The committee recommends to moving swiftly to order the truck. An additional parttime employee will be added because of the additional workload and maintenance.
