1. GHF

- a. Farm update
 - i. Americore Team to the farm until April 26
 - ii. 45% enrollment for farm camp and they begin in late June
 - iii. Spring Field trips begin March 14th
 - iv. Tea Party on April 6 in honor of the Trossett Wildflower
 - v. Lots of classes coming up
 - vi. Mini-outreach events- the first on at Mad Tree- March 18 at 6:00 pm
 - vii. Bank Barn- an agreement has been signed to work begin in March

2. Fire

- a. Tuition reimbursement ordinance is being worked on for council on Tuesday
- b. Ordinance accepting a bid from Roseman Enterprise DBA as Clean Air Concepts will be ready for Tuesday. The price is under the FEMA grant.
- c. The grant for the cot for new ambulance will be applied for March 23rd.

3. Police

- a. The coyote management program for the year is over and 17 have been collected. The snares and traps will be collected.
- b. Tuition reimbursement ordinance will be ready for Tuesday.

4. Service/Engineering

- a. The check from the garden club has been received.
- b. Thru the Valley update- shut down has begun until weather gets better.
- c. AeroHub update plats should be recorded soon
- d. Duke pipeline update- 3rd public hearing March 21st and NOPE at rec center March 13th.
- e. Gas tax fund could potentially go up from \$250,000 to \$400,000.
- f. Cindy Walters is off probationary period end on April 2nd and move to step 3.

- g. Heavy equipment update- Mr. Jeffers provided a report on heavy equipment and their life cycle. \$30,000 has been spent this first 2 months of 2019 on repairs and a truck is still out and waiting for a part.
- h. Alberndeen/KemmeTransmission- Alberdeen has moved out and Kemme should be finished next week.
- i. A plan should be made for all the equipment and new duties that the service department has taken on.
- j. Summer seasonal pay rates should be discussed and evaluated since the rates appear to be lower than surrounding businesses and some communities.

5. Other Business

- a. Modal Shop and Sherwin Williams hopefully will close soon.
- b. Dunkin Donuts would like to do a .65 acre lot in front of Sports Plus and will need a variance and scheduled for BZA on March 21st. The south side of Reading Rd is heavy commercial.
 - i. Wendy's sits on an one acre lot that was part of the zoning code at that time
 - ii. They will also need conditional use approval
 - iii. They will also need a curb cut on Reading Rd
 - iv. They will come before the planning commission in April
- c. RFP AeroHub- Neyer and Pure Development have submitted plans. Miller Valentine did not submit. Pure will be available at the April 2nd 5:00 meeting.
- d. Health Insurance might take a 15-20% increase and Mr. Elmer is having the broker look at other plans.
