1. GHF

- a. Beth Walker has been promoted to Volunteer Manager replacing Claire Long who is stepping aside on June 28th. Thanks to Claire for her service.
- b. Summer kid's camp has started and runs through August 7th.
- c. Our mule team of Jim and George are retiring to a local farm in Ross, Ohio. We will be purchasing a new team that should be on the farm for training early this summer.
- d. Row by Row tickets and Event/ Table Sponsorships are currently available. Early bird sales will end June 30th.
- e. G.E. Credit Union is a new corporate partner.

2. Fire

- a. Firefighter / Paramedic Roger Neff will retire on August 4th. Many thanks to Roger for his dedicated service to the Village. Mr. Robert Green is going through his final evaluation and will be sworn in on July 9th and start his orientation on July 10th.
- b. The departments 60th Anniversary Celebration was held on Memorial Day and was a big success.

3. Police

- a. Karen Hall will be retiring on November 30th. Process has started to find her replacement.
- b. G.E. is currently in contract negotiations with their union. Current contract expires on June 23rd. Possible strike date of July 1st.

4. Service/Engineering

- a. Final numbers are not yet in, but this years Shred Day volume was larger than last years.
- b. Thru The Valley – work is progressing nicely. Northbound on and off ramps have shifted. Work is expected to shift from the southbound lanes on I-75 to the northbound lanes later this summer.
- c. AeroHub south road is progressing and ready for The Modal Shop to begin site prep and construction.
- d. The proposed Duke Pipeline project is now in the hands of the Ohio Siting Board with no timetable currently in place.
- e. Glendale-Milford bridge towers will go out for bid this month.

5. Other Business

- a. There will be an ordinance on the June Council agenda for employee healthcare insurance. Increase is approximately 9.8% over last year. Total cost increases from \$935M last to \$1.027 M this year. Open enrollment is June 18th and June 19th.
- b. The Ohio Risk Insurance Policy is increasing from \$73M last year to approximately \$80-\$85M this year.
- c. Princeton City Schools Superintendent Mr. Tom Burton has a meet and greet scheduled for 11:30 a.m. on June 17th at the Evendale Rec Center.
