Call to Artists! Evendale Fine Arts Annual Exhibit May 4, 2012 through May 7, 2012 Sponsored by the Village and the Evendale Cultural Arts Center

The exhibit will be held in the secure Community Room in the Evendale Recreation Center at 10500 Reading Rd. An opening reception for the artists will be held Friday evening, May 4th, from 6:00 P.M. - 9:00 P.M.

To be eligible artists must live within a 30-mile radius of Evendale, must be working currently in original paintings, pastels, sketches, etchings or sculpture, and be at least 21 years of age. Each artist may submit up to three pieces of artwork. Giclées, prints, or computer generated art will not be considered.

Submitted work will be juried for inclusion into the show by internationally known artist David Mueller, who will sit as juror for the selection process. Acceptance letters will be mailed the week of March 26, 2012. Early Bird Deadline is Monday, March 5, 2012 and the Extended Deadline is Monday, March 12, 2012.

All hanging works must be well framed and wired for presentation. The submitted works may be marked for sale or for exhibition only. No commission is taken. The Exhibition Committee will coordinate sales.
