

Dear Neighbors and Friends:

In last month's newsletter, I told you about the Village's attempt to control the destruction the Emerald Ash Borer is causing to some of the trees along our streets. You may be receiving solicitations from outside contractors for tree removal. Please be mindful of whom you allow to perform services on your property. If a large down payment is requested for work to be completed, that may be an indication of a scam. It is recommended that you get everything in writing. Contractors are required to provide you with a three-day right-to-cancel notice prior to beginning any work. Commercial solicitation in the Village is regulated through our Ordinances and any company soliciting you must have Village registration paperwork. Feel free to contact the Police Department (563-2249) if you have questions or concerns.

Gorman Heritage Farm has recently been recognized locally and nationally. Jim and Dorothy Gorman were posthumously awarded the "Voices of Giving" award by the Greater Cincinnati Planned Giving Council. This award recognizes their generosity in donating the farm for public use. GHF has also been placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Farm is going to have a reception on October 7th, 4pm to 6pm to honor the dedication of the staff and volunteers. Residents are invited to attend.

I NEED YOUR FEEDBACK. The Service Department is going to place temporary lane markers on Giverny Boulevard where it intersects Glendale-Milford Road. These markers will restrict the area to one lane and our expectation is that it relieves some conflicts when trying to turn onto Glendale-Milford Road. If you use the intersection after the change, I would like your input. Please call the main Village number 563-2244 and simply say if you like the configuration or do not like the configuration.
