AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 258.110 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE, DEFINING HOLIDAY LEAVE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Village staff and the Mayor have recommended a modification to the Village's Holiday Leave Policy; and

WHEREAS, It is appropriate to exchange the Good Friday holiday for the Martin Luther King holiday; and

WHEREAS, Council also deems it appropriate to provide some holiday pay to those individuals who are part-time individuals; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE, STATE OF OHIO, six members concurring, that:

SECTION 1: Section 258.110, Holiday Leave Credited, of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Evendale, is hereby amended to read as follows:

258.110 Holiday Leave Credited

- (a) All regular or probationary full-time employees, other than Fire Captains, Lieutenants and Firefighters and Police Lieutenants, Sergeants, and Patrolmen, shall be entitled to be absent from duty without loss of compensation on the following holidays. All benefits for new employees shall be pro-rated based on the portion of the year worked by the employee.
 - (1) New Year's Day
 - (2) Martin Luther King Day
 - (3) Memorial Day
 - (4) Fourth of July
 - (5) Labor Day
 - (6) Thanksgiving Day
 - (7) Friday following Thanksgiving Day
 - (8) The day before or after Christmas (as determined by the Mayor)
 - (9) Christmas Day
- (b) The Mayor may require any employee to work on the above holidays, and give such employee a substitute day off.
- (c) Any employee who is eligible for holiday pay is entitled to one floating holiday in addition to the holidays detailed above. Said floating holiday shall be scheduled by the employee with the approval of their supervisor and must be taken in the year in which it is earned. The employee shall be responsible for scheduling the holiday with their supervisor early enough in the year to allow for the efficient operation of the employee's department. The employee's failure to do so may result in the employee not being able to take the holiday at no penalty to the Village.
- (d) All part-time employees who work between 1,300 and 1,950 hours per payroll year are entitled to holiday pay in accordance with the below schedule.

Hours Worked	Paid Hours Per Holiday
1,300 – 1,400	5
1,401 - 1,500	5.5
1,501 - 1,600	6
1,600+	6.5

SECTION 2:

The reason for said emergency is the need to establish work schedules for 2018 and provide for the Martin Luther King Holiday to be in effect in January.

Therefore, this ordinance shall become effective immediately.

- 3) Swim Safe includes the cost of uniforms in their contract, while Cincinnati Pool requires their employees to purchase uniforms;
- 4) Swim Safe's services are all locally provided, while Cincinnati Pools is part of a pool management group and relies on the group's technical back-up teams that would have to come in from Georgia;
- 5) Swim Safe has extensive experience in the operation municipal pools. Swim Safe's bid indicates it now provides pool management services to 7 Greater Cincinnati municipalities, while Cincinnati Pool's experience is, based on its bid, limited to managing private pools; and
- Swim Safe has operated the Evendale pool complex with great success and to the satisfaction of the Village for more than 10 years, knows the expectations of the community and based on the delivery of services in the past, the Village is confident that they will continue to perform their contractual obligations in running the pool complex at a high level of performance; now, therefore

Swim Safe Pool Management, Inc. conforming to the terms described in its bid.
