RESOLUTION #15-03**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EVENDALE POLICE DEPARTMENT
TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HAMILTON COUNTY HEROIN COALITION
TASK-FORCE**

- WHEREAS,** heroin-involved deaths in Hamilton County, including homicides and overdose fatalities numbered 177 in 2014 and 182 in 2013; and
- WHEREAS,** law enforcement authorities on the local, state, and federal level recognize that heroin-involved deaths require a coordinated response from law enforcement together with other community resources, and further requires a consistent investigative response across jurisdictional lines; and
- WHEREAS,** the epidemic of heroin-involved deaths and overdose incidents constitutes a present public emergency affecting the safety and health of county residents and communities; and
- WHEREAS,** Hamilton County has formed the Hamilton County Heroin Coalition to serve as a platform for collaboration between cities, townships, and agencies now addressing the heroin/opiate addiction problem and its attendant issues; and
- WHEREAS,** the Hamilton County Heroin Coalition has established a law enforcement task force to investigate and prosecute crimes related to heroin overdose incidents in Hamilton County, Ohio; and
- WHEREAS,** the Village of Evendale has adopted and its Police Department participates in the county-wide mutual aid agreement which provides for multi-jurisdictional cooperation in law enforcement matters including multi-jurisdictional drug task forces;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village Council of the Village of Evendale, Hamilton County, Ohio, six members concurring, that:

- SECTION I** The Police Department is hereby authorized to participate in the Hamilton County Heroin Coalition Task Force together with other law enforcement agencies in the investigation of heroin overdose incidents.
- SECTION II** The Chief of Police is authorized to enter into memoranda of understanding with the Task Force and other local, state, and federal authorities to accomplish the purposes for which the task force was formed.

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO HIRE
SEASONAL EMPLOYEES AND SETTING PAY RATES
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Evendale has enacted Chapter 260 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Evendale requiring authorization by Council for the Mayor to hire seasonal employees; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor has submitted a list of seasonal employees who may be employed for a particular season or seasons.

WHEREAS, the Mayor has fully complied with Section 260.06(a) of the Codified Ordinances of Evendale and recommended that Council authorize the hiring of the individuals specified below for seasonal positions for which employment is authorized by this ordinance.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE, STATE OF OHIO, six members concurring that:

SECTION 1: The following persons may be employed during a particular season or seasons by the Mayor of the Village of Evendale as Seasonal Employees at the hourly rate or lump sum rate established for each person by this Ordinance:

ORDINANCE #15-31**

**ORDINANCE RATIFYING AND APPROVING FEES PAID FOR
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES IN EVENDALE'S MAYOR'S COURT AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, The operation of Evendale's Mayor's Court depends on professional services of three different attorneys serving in different roles; and

WHEREAS, The Police Chief of the Village of Evendale confirms that those individuals perform their roles appropriately as professionals and has recommended the adoption of this ordinance; now,

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE, STATE OF OHIO, six members concurring that:

SECTION 1: The Council of the Village of Evendale hereby authorizes, approves and ratifies the following payments to professionals serving in Mayor's Court:

1. Mayor's Court Magistrate, Sal G. Scrafano
\$450 per Mayor's Court session
2. Sandy Schilling, Mayor's Court Prosecutor, was addressed separately in the budget, Ordinance 14-65.
Her pay is governed by that ordinance.
3. Marina Marinakis, Mayor's Court Public Defender
\$150 per assigned client and \$75 per hour for those matters transferred to Hamilton County Municipal Court.

SECTION 2: This ordinance is declared to be an emergency by a concurrence of six members of Council, being necessary to preserve the public peace, order, safety, health or welfare of the Village of Evendale or to provide for the daily operation of a department or office of the Village of Evendale. The reason for said emergency is the need to provide for ongoing services in Evendale Mayor's Court in order to operate the court appropriately. Therefore, this ordinance shall become effective immediately.
