Dear Neighbors and Friends,

After careful consideration, the Village is changing membership and rental fees in the Recreation Department for the following reasons; First, Evendale has not raised fees for seventeen years. Obviously, operational and capital costs have gone up over the past seventeen years while membership revenues have remained the same. Additionally, memberships are being simplified, including the consolidation of several “ala-carte” options, thereby enabling users to experience a wider breadth of services but still at competitively low rates. Second, hourly rates for several part-time/seasonal positions are currently at or near State minimum wage making it difficult to attract and retain part-time/seasonal staff. The Village is considering wage raises for these positions. These changes will enable the Recreation Department to continue to provide high-quality programs, events and services that residents have enjoyed for decades. I want to thank the Recreation Commission for their due diligence in making these recommendations to Council. They will be reviewed and considered in upcoming Council meetings. All changes will be posted on our website and throughout the Recreation Center.

While we opposed the Duke gas pipeline through the Village, it has resulted in some benefits to the community; First, Duke repaved, striped, and installed new curb work along Glendale-Milford Road saving Evendale about \$700,000 according to our Engineer. The Village would have had to make these road improvements, at our cost, in upcoming years. Second, Duke ran electric to where the former Griffin House used to sit. This will allow us to re-activate the aerator in the Griffin Nature Preserve pond. Finally, the Village received money from Duke to extend the irrigation system on the soccer field behind the Cultural Arts Center.

Our safety committee implemented several strategies as a trial run during our recent Halloween Fest. It went very well. The Village is now looking at similar strategies for our 2022 Fourth of July event which will have over 5,000 people in attendance compared to Halloween Fest which had over 800 participants. One thing the Committee agreed upon was to buy a drone for use at Village events as well as at the Gorman Heritage Farm. Aerial coverage enables, among other things, quicker identification of, and response time to, potential safety issues.

Oh yes, I am sure you have noticed that Homer’s is now gone. After much pressure from the Village, the property owner voluntarily demolished the vacant, dilapidated structure. Now, everyone wants to know what is going into the empty lot. The Village is not aware of any official redevelopment plans at this time.

The Griffin Nature Preserve is getting some professional attention. The Village is hiring an environmental contractor to abate honeysuckle, and other invasive species, at the end of November. They will likely continue abatement efforts again next year. We have a committee of volunteers who are lending a helping hand. They can always use more help so please contact the Village if you’re interested.

I want to wish everyone in the Village a Merry Christmas, Happy Holidays and a Happy New Year. Make sure it is a safe one.

VILLAGE OF EVENDALE ADOPTED ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

The following ordinances were opted by the Council of the Village of Evendale at the Regular Council Meeting on November 9, 2021.

Ord 21-72
ORDINANCE PROMOTING FIREFIGHTER-PARAMEDIC INSPECTOR JOSHUA R. ASBACH TO LIEUTENANT-PARAMEDIC OF EVENDALE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.

ORD #21-73 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO EXERCISE THE OPTION YEAR, 2022 AND 2023 CONTAINED IN THE CONTRACT WITH RUMPKE OF OHIO, INC. FOR WASTE COLLECTION AND RECYLING SERVICES AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE 18-76 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.

ORD #21-74 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AND CONVEY A UTILITY EASEMENT TO DUKE ENERGY, OHIO FOR AEROHUB AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.

ORD #21-75 ORDINANCE AGREEING TO THE EXTENSION OF THE CONTRACT WITH JP MORGAN CHASE BANK, N.A. TO PROVIDE BANKING AND DEPOSITORY SERVICES FOR THE VILLAGE OF EVENDALE AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE ANY DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THAT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.

ORD #21-76 ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 288.02 DEFINING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE CULTURAL ARTS COMMISSION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.

ORD #21-78 ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH ANTHEM AND SUPERIOR DENTAL CARE TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH INSURANCE AND DENTAL BENEFITS TO FULL TIME VILLAGE EMPLOYEES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. Unanimously approved.



SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Service Department would like you to know that snow removal will take place, just like in past years, with the main roads requiring attention first. GORMAN HERITAGE FARM

Season's Greetings from the Evendale Fire Department!

The holidays are upon us, and the Evendale Fire Department would like to wish the Village a happy and safe holiday season. Here are a few fire safety reminders to help keep your family and friends safe during this year's festivities:

- Maintain at least 3 feet of space between candles and flammable items such as curtains and holiday decorations. Candles should be placed on a non-flammable surface and never left unattended.
- Choose a Christmas tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched. Cut 2 inches from the base of the trunk to allow the tree to better absorb water. Make sure the tree is at least three feet from any heat source and not blocking an exit. Remember to add water to the tree stand daily and always turn decorative lighting off before leaving home or going to bed.
- Some decorative lighting and extension cords are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both. Review and only use appropriate lights and extension cords for your decorations. Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections, only connect as many strands as recommended by the manufacture. Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged. Never leave extension cords plugged in when not in use, and remember to turn off lights when leaving home or going to bed.
- Test your smoke alarms and remember to leave a clear exit path by keeping decorations away from windows and doors.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking holiday meals on the stove.

Please keep these holiday best practices in mind while celebrating this year. As always, feel free to call or stop by the station at any time with questions or concerns.

New Membership and Rental Fees Effective December 1st, 2021

The Evendale Recreation Commission, the Director of Recreation and Program Supervisors from the Recreation Department have spent the past several months researching, analyzing and discussing Evendale's and other communities' membership and rental fees. In an effort to remain competitive, and to retain a high level of service for our members, memberships and rental fees will increase on December 1st. In addition, membership categories will be streamlined, and the age will increase from 55 to 65 years of age for our senior discounts.

The Mayor, Council and Recreation Commission have reviewed these recommendations, and they are in full support of this decision. Please note that membership fees have not changed since 2004. Our new fees are still well below several of our neighboring communities, parks and area fitness centers. Moving forward, fees will be reviewed every 3 to 5 years to make sure that we continue to provide high level programs and activities for our members at one of the best values in Southwestern Ohio.
