Dear Neighbors and Friends,

About four years ago, the Village purchased ten police body cameras that have served us well. I believe body cameras are a good idea as they provide evidence of police activity. Unfortunately, as with most technological devices, cameras develop problems and older systems are not supported by the manufacturer. New cameras cost \$800.00. Video storage capacity and data integrity are also factors that impact cost when considering camera replacements and video access/serviceability options. We will continue to use body cameras but are mindful of the short and long-term expenses associated with their use.

Earlier this month, I asked Council to take a look at our employee compensation structure due to the ever-increasing costs associated with health care and the recent 5-7% surge in the Midwest consumer price index. We gave employees a 1% raise for 2022; but, the employee share of our healthcare premium, coupled with higher health plan deductibles, etc. are starting to outweigh raises. The Village is fortunate to employ quality, professional staff; therefore, it's important to make sure our overall compensation strategy enables the Village to attract and retain good employees while staying within budget and protecting our reserve funds.

Some good news is that we received a grant from Hamilton County to demolish the old trucking company headquarters on Glendale-Milford Road. The Village purchased the dilapidated property several years ago to redevelop it as part of our AeroHub project. The grant is for \$290,400 which is 80% of project costs. The Village must fund the 20% balance. The bad news is that we currently garage some of our Service Department equipment in those buildings. However, clearing the site will greatly enhance our chances of selling the lot.

As to AeroHub itself, we continue to receive many inquiries. However, the Covid pandemic and the price of steel (300% increase in 2021) have caused many companies to pause on new construction.

I hope everyone had a chance to view our holiday greetings from the Village on YouTube or Facebook. Steve Berke, our newest Council member, took on that project and did a great job. Thank you, Steve!!

Finally, we also won a \$215,000 State Capitol grant for a new Cultural Arts Center elevator. Add that to the prior state grant of \$100,000 and a private grant of \$100,000 and we are making real progress! Remember, we need 1 million dollars to do the job.

SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Service Department would like you to know that snow removal will take place, just like in past years, with the main roads requiring attention first. The neighborhood streets will be taken care of as soon as possible. Along with clearing snow, please remember to move vehicles off the roads to allow the plow crews to do the best possible job. Your help with this process will be appreciated.

The department's branch chipping service will not take place when the streets need snow removal. Safe roads are our first priority.

NOW HIRING

TAX DEPARTMENT

Tax Forms - The 2021 Evendale Individual Income Tax Returns (Form IR) were mailed out on January 14, 2022. If you have not received your tax return, the forms are available on our website, evendaleohio.org/tax-department. The Due Date for filing your 2021 Evendale Income Tax Return, and paying the tax due, is **April 18, 2022**.

Work From Home - If you worked from home during the tax year 2021, and have requested a refund of local tax withheld by your employer for the work place city, the tax withheld by the employer and reported on Form W-2, must be reduced by the amount of the refund when computing the Evendale Credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality (Line 5c of Form IR).

E-file/E-pay - The E-file system is available for most individuals to file their 2021 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return. You may access the system by visiting our website. An E-pay system is included as an option for paying the balance of tax due by credit card. A service fee is charged by the 3rd party credit card processor if utilizing E-Pay.

COVID-19 Impacts on operations - Covid-19 continues to impact business operations. In-person taxpayer assistance remains suspended at this time. Taxpayer assistance is still available by telephone and by email.

Dropping off Information - If you need to visit our office to drop off tax information or to drop off your completed tax return, you may do so at the Administration Lobby window, M-F 8:00am to 4:00pm. You may also use the secured Tax Department Drop Box located in the Lobby of our Police Department after normal business hours. The Police Department Lobby is open 24/7.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Can We Find Your House During an Emergency?

In the event of an emergency, one of the most critical steps for us at the Evendale Fire Department is to be able to locate the address of that emergency. Having address numbers clearly visible from the street helps us reach you in your time of need as quickly as possible. 911 dispatch software and GPS systems have improved our emergency responses tremendously over the years, however, as we approach in our ambulances, fire trucks, or police vehicles, we still need to be able to identify the correct address of the emergency. The Evendale Fire Department would like to encourage you to examine how your home address is displayed and take steps to ensure it is readily visible to us if we need to respond. Here are some considerations when labeling your home address:

- Use plain numerals. Scripted or spelled out numbers look nice, however, they are not easily or quickly identifiable from our approaching vehicles.
- Address numbers should be displayed on front of your house, at a mailbox, or a post at the end of the driveway if your house is set back off the main roadway. When displaying your address on the front of the house, make sure that it is in a well-lit location. This will ensure that the numbers are clear and obvious to emergency responders.
- Address numbers should be at least four inches in height and of a contrasting color to their background. Metallic, brass, or bronze finishes are not recommended as they are not as easily seen from approaching vehicles.
- Keep address numbers clear from obstructions such as trees, shrubs, flowers, and decorations.

The next time you are returning home, take a look at how your address is displayed. Ask yourself, could first responders easily find my home? Every minute spent attempting to locate an address delays our response to your emergency. Please take a look at how your home address is displayed and follow these guidelines to help us help you. As always, feel free to call or stop by the firehouse with any questions.

The essay and the scholarship application, along with the recommendation forms must be received by April 1, 2022 for consideration.

We will base our selection on the following criteria, not necessarily in this order: Academics, Financial Need, Community Involvement, School Activities, Leadership Roles and others.

Finalists will be selected from those

applications received and results announced on April 8, 2022.

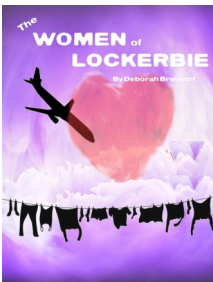
