

VILLAGE OF EVENDALE

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

We recently made a pitch for \$500,000 from the State of Ohio Capital Grants for an elevator for the Cultural Arts Building. Myself with James Jeffers, our Village Engineer and Susan Gordy, the Cultural Arts Director, presented the proposal to the Cincinnati Business Committee along with State legislators. The total cost of the project is estimated to be over one million dollars. We already have \$100,000 from the State from a past capital grant; plus, \$105,000 from a grant and a private donation. The rest, if we get our grant request amount, would have to come out of our Village reserves.

Mr. Jeffers and I traveled to Columbus last month to testify about ephemeral streams. This was before an Ohio Senate Committee concerning H.B. 175. An ephemeral stream has flowing water only during, and for a short duration after, precipitation events. An ephemeral stream is on the AeroHub property and you would barely get your shoes wet during heavy rains. Nonetheless, ephemeral streams are considered a waterway of the United States, regulated by the Ohio EPA. The proposed Bill would take control of the stream away from The Ohio EPA and return it to local control. The Bill's outcome will not be known until later this year.

If you have not been by the enclosed shelter house, you might want to take a look. It has been power washed and painted in the Evendale colors. It looks 100% better!

This time of the year, residents may be receiving calls from people suggesting they have a deal for them on their electric or gas rate. When receiving any type of unsolicited call for sales or services, please The Village has an aggregation program for both utilities with a supplier called exercise caution! Constellation New Energy. All homes are enrolled in the program, at no cost, but residents can choose to opt-out at any time. Please remember that Duke Energy will always be the default supplier, billing agent and transmitter of utilities. Constellation most often has consistently lower rates than Duke and many other suppliers. If you have opted out, I suggest you consider re-enrolling. FIRE DEPARTMENT

Winter Fire Safety

We are settling into the coldest months of the year and with that the Evendale Fire Department would like to provide you with a few tips to help keep you and your family safe this winter. Heating your home is a necessity, but it must be done safely. With home heating sources such as furnaces, fire places, and space heaters come additional safety concerns like carbon monoxide and electrical fires.

Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless, harmful gas that is produced by incomplete combustion. This gas can accumulate in a home when a gas fed furnace or water heater is not functioning properly, or when a chimney is not properly cleaned. The EFD would like to remind you to have your furnaces serviced regularly and your fireplace chimneys professionally cleaned to avoid the buildup of carbon monoxide. The EFD also recommends installing a carbon monoxide detector outside of living spaces such as bed rooms at a minimum and testing them once a month. If you are in need of a carbon monoxide or smoke detector, please either stop by the fire station or call us and we can bring them to you. Carbon Monoxide detectors are ten dollars each, while smoke detectors are free of charge.

The winter months carry an exceptionally high electrical fire risk for home owners. Such risk is heightened due to the use of electrical heating appliances such as space heaters. The National Fire Protection Association states that there are approximately 45,000 home electrical fires each year with the peak months of electrical fire related casualties between November and March. The NFPA also states that one in every seven home fires involves heating equipment such as space heaters. The EFD encourages you to use these appliances with caution to avoid such emergencies.

When using a space heater, or any heating device, remember to keep any flammable objects at least three feet away and never leave space heaters unattended (such as during sleeping hours). Only electrical space heaters should be used indoors, all gas burning space heaters should be used in a well ventilated area outdoors. Electrical heating appliances like space heaters require an elevated amount of electricity to operate, and therefore create the risk of overloading the wiring that they are plugged into if not operated properly. When using a space heater, make sure that it is the only appliance plugged into and running on that outlet. Never use extension cords with space heaters. Extension cords often are not properly rated for the electrical demand of these appliances and can be subject to failure and fire when they are used together.

Keep these tips in mind over the coming months as we look ahead to warmer days. As always, please call 513-563-2248 or stop by the fire station with any questions or concerns.


