

# **VILLAGE OF EVENDALE**

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

I am sure that many of you have seen the fight going on between The Ohio General Assembly and The Ohio Supreme Court over the state's redistricting map. The Court has threatened to hold the leaders of the General Assembly in contempt and send them to jail. Well, that brings back memories of the school funding issue while I was The President of the Ohio Senate. The same thing was threatened to me at the time. I/we could not come up with a funding plan for our schools. The Court suggested I could be jailed for contempt. So, the press went to my chief fiscal officer and asked if I would really go to jail. No, he answered, Senator Finan will send staff. By the way, that issue has still not been solved for Ohio but it is just ignored.

We will have three new police officers soon. Sgt. Abrams is retiring July 1<sup>st</sup> and both the Chief and the Assistant Chief are retiring in June. Lt. Tim Holloway will be our new Police Chief come June. Lt. Sean McKinney will become our new Assistant Chief. Both applied for the Chief's position and it was very difficult to decide between the two men. They both are extremely well qualified and dedicated to the Evendale Police Department, as well as service to the community.

The Grand Opening of iSpace in the Village is set for May 4<sup>th</sup> from 6:00-8:00pm. iSpace is the co-owner with Gorman Heritage Farm of the former UAW building on Reading Road by the entrance to the Farm. iSpace has been in business for 21 years and was previously housed on the Scarlet Oaks campus. They are all about educating children (and some adults) about space travel. They impact 30,000 children in 500 schools annually. Come on down and see what they are all about. I think they complement our farm education programs. As a matter of fact, they have named the building "Soil and Stars."

Gas aggregation contracts are coming up. Unfortunately, our consultant (Energy Alliance) has not been able to secure a new, long-term contract below Duke Energy's rate. Our current contract rate of .396 cents per ccf expires at the end of May. Duke Energy then becomes our default supplier, currently at .8142 cents per ccf. That is a big jump. However, Energy Alliance hopes to secure a new contract for Evendale this summer; so, please keep this in mind should you be solicited from gas suppliers. 


#### Micro Soccer:
