Last month, I mentioned in the newsletter that we were going to build pickleball courts this year. Believe it or not, the Village did not get a single bid for construction of the courts. Consequently, we will try again after the first of the year in anticipation that contractors will have interest in bidding the project at that time.

After 11 years of much-appreciated service to the Village, Maureen Flavin, our Treasurer, is resigning her position. Please join me in thanking her for her service. I've appointed Carolyn O. Carmody to the position. Please join me in welcoming Carolyn and wishing her all the best.

The crosswalk flags that were installed on Cooper Road are being used and are appreciated. Contrary to my last newsletter, they have not been misplaced; rather, people have simply placed them in different receptacles. Thank you to everyone who initiated and implemented this safety-focused service.

Unfortunately, Evendale recently experienced a couple of home break-ins. Police are actively investigating both cases. Fortunately, no one was physically harmed in either case. Regardless, Evendale officials understand the serious nature of these matters and are diligently pursuing both investigations. If you witness any unusual activity in your neighborhood, please report it to the Police immediately. Also, please be sure to routinely lock doors, windows, garages and set security systems to protect your home and belongings. Security cameras and systems often act as visible deterrents to would-be thieves. Evendale is nearly finished with grading Lot 2 in AeroHub, the former site of a transmission shop and trucking facility, making the 9+ acres pad-ready for future redevelopment. The grading is being funded, in part, by a Hamilton County grant.

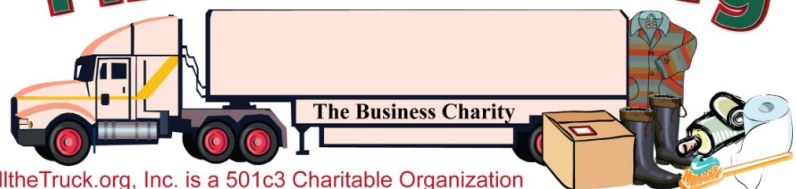

Farm Fresh Turkey

It doesn't get any more local than this! Our turkeys are raised with care on our pastures, eating seeds, bugs and weeds while enjoying the warm sunshine. Their diet is fortified with non-GMO feed that we grind right here with our own corn. As a result, they are not only healthier but taste better too! Reserve your turkey in advance; we sell out every year. Turkeys are first come, first serve. No refunds are given and we cannot hold turkeys overnight, they must be picked up on the day and time specified. Pickup is the Monday before Thanksgiving and usually begins at 6pm. You will receive an email with more information the week before pickup.



- Deposit: \$50.00 per turkey.
- Price: \$5.50 per pound (balance after deposit to be paid upon pick-up).
- Average weight is 15-23 pounds.

- Builds early STEM skills by encouraging observations, focusing on sensory experiences, and categorizing plants and animals based on shared characteristics
- Fosters a comfort in nature by creating positive experiences outdoors in colder weather and encouraging hands-on outdoor experiences
