Dear Neighbors and Friends,

We sold another lot in our AeroHub development. Starting this summer, The General Tool Company (GTC) will construct a 55,000± sq. ft. advanced manufacturing facility to build power units for Naval destroyers. I want to thank GTC's leadership and all Village officials and staff for their time and dedication to making this project a reality.

A quick reminder that space is available on our Memorial Wall for new veterans who may have recently left military service since our Wall and Tower were built several years ago honoring our local military, police and fire. If you have an interest, please contact Kathy Kincaid at the Village offices, 513-563-2244.

Our four pickleball courts are just about ready. We put together a friendly match of Village staff to test the courts before inviting you to come to use them. Please contact the Recreation Department to learn more. Watch our Village Facebook page for updates.

We are exploring the idea of going to a 12-hour workday for our police department. Currently, they work 10 hours. A number of our neighboring communities have taken this path and it seems to work.

If you see stakes by the side of the road with pink ribbons attached, these indicate the location of new public trees to soon be planted. Sixty-six new trees are scheduled to be planted helping to keep our Village attractive and green.

The State Legislature recently raised the amount municipalities are allowed to spend on purchases without going out for bids. \$75,000 is the new amount, up from \$50,000. The legislation also allows a 3% increase to this new amount each year.

The new security flock cameras recently installed at key intersections around the Village, continue to assist law enforcement in solving crimes. The cameras are not only helpful in providing factual evidence for vehicle accidents, law enforcement can also, if/when needed, detect vehicle plates entering/exiting the Village immediately following criminal activity.

Schools will be back in session soon, please be safe in areas where kids wait for the buses.

### ORDINANCE #23-40

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF AMOUNTS DUE UPON CERTAIN CONTRACTS REQUIRING CERTIFICATION OF AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. (Approved Unanimously)



SERVICE DEPARTMENT

Remember! Leaf Bags will be distributed in late September and October. Stay tuned for further details. The details will be posted on Facebook and the Village web site, when they become available.

The Service Department reminds everyone it is the responsibility of the resident to have contractors, tree surgeons, landscapers, etc., remove their own materials and waste from the property.

- All items to be chipped are to be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday morning.
- Tree limbs and branches should be no larger than 8" in diameter.
- Pile tree limbs neatly with the stalk end at the curb.
- The following <u>CANNOT</u> be chipped: vines, garden waste, wood with nails or bushes with an excessive amount of dirt on roots. All vines and garden waste should be in bags for Rumpke pickup, not more than 50 pounds.
- Please remove the root ball from trees and bushes for pickup.

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT**

## **Can We Find Your Home During an Emergency?**

In the event of an emergency, one of the most critical steps for us at the Evendale Fire Department is to be able to locate the address of that emergency. Having address numbers clearly visible from the street helps us reach you in your time of need as quickly as possible.

The Evendale Fire Department would like to encourage you to examine how your home address is displayed and take steps to ensure it is readily visible to us if we need to respond. Here are some considerations when labeling your home address:

- Use plain numerals. Scripted or spelled out numbers look nice; however, they are not easily or quickly identifiable from our approaching vehicles.
- Address numbers should be displayed on front of your house, at a mailbox, or post at the end of the driveway if your house is set back off the main roadway. When displaying your address on the front of the house, make sure that it is in a well-lit location. This will ensure that the numbers are clear and obvious to emergency responders.
- Address numbers should be at least four inches in height and of a contrasting color to their background. Metallic, brass, or bronze finishes are not recommended as they are not as easily seen from approaching vehicles.
- Keep address numbers clear from obstructions such as trees, shrubs, flowers, and decorations.

Along with address identification, it is critical that the fire department be able to quickly find a fire hydrant in the event of a house fire. We would also like to take the opportunity to remind residents to maintain accessible space around your fire hydrants. In the coming months, you may see members of the fire department out and about in your neighborhood servicing the fire hydrants. We do this throughout the year to ensure that these hydrants are in proper working order should they ever be needed. In the event of a fire, these hydrants supply our trucks with necessary water to safely resolve the emergency. The fire department would like to remind you to please maintain a two-foot space around the fire hydrants that is clear of any tall landscaping or other obstructions. We ask this so that when we respond to an emergency, we can clearly identify where the nearest hydrant is and operate the fire hydrant without any delays. Our response and its impact to life safety in the event of a house fire is extremely time sensitive, so every second saved identifying and operating our fire hydrants helps provide the best outcome for our Village residents. Starting September 1<sup>st</sup>, the fire department will begin clearing landscaping that obstructs the identification and operation of the Village fire hydrants.

The next time you are returning home, take a look at how your address is displayed. Ask yourself, could first responders easily find my home? Is my nearest fire hydrant in plain sight and clear of obstructions? Every minute spent attempting to locate an address or hydrant delays our response to your emergency. Please take a look at how your home address is displayed and follow these guidelines to help us help you. As always, feel free to call or stop by the firehouse with any questions.



## **GORMAN HERITAGE FARM**

#### Have you ever heard of a Chicken Tractor?



At Gorman Heritage Farm we use sustainable agriculture methods, and this means raising our chickens outside in the field or pasture. The birds are able to peck and forage for plants and bugs, stretch their legs and wings, and feel warm sunshine on

their feathers. Of course we also provide plenty of chicken feed and fresh water too inside speciallydesigned enclosures called "chicken tractors." These enclosures protect them from predators and provide shelter from the elements. All the green space of the Farm and the lovely Village of Evendale hosts many wild critters that enjoy a chicken dinner including raccoons, opossums, foxes, coyotes, weasels, and even great horned owls! But our chickens are safe inside their "tractors," named such because we can move them across the farm fields sort of like a mechanical tractor. Every day, our farm staff manually moves the tractors to a new area of pasture so the chickens can access fresh forage. Raising chickens on pasture produces happy and healthy birds, makes healthy soil for our crops, and results in flavorful food for our tables. Stop into the Farm Shop to purchase some pasture-raised chicken from the freezer. You can't get any more local and sustainable than this!


