Dear Neighbors and Friends,

If you recently watched an evening news story about a large fire in Africa, you might have seen our Village name on the firefighter's turnout gear. The Village of Evendale proudly partners with a local non-profit called Africa Fire Missions. This organization acquires older fire equipment, still in functioning order, and provides it to African communities that have little or no equipment whatsoever. We are fortunate to have high-level professional public services in Evendale with staff and officials that, when possible, assist other communities in need even if they are across the globe.

The Inter-Community Cable Regulatory Commission is looking for an oral history of General Electric Aerospace from its beginning. Anyone available? If so, please contact me and I'll direct you to the appropriate Commission representative.

Speaking of GE, several residents have contacted Village officials about a recent uptick in noise levels coming from the GE campus. In response to those concerns, Staff and I recently met with GE representatives and brought this issue to their attention. While GE representatives are not able to discuss the precise source of the noise, it is likely related to some form of endurance testing that requires night-time operations. While we appreciate all that GE does as the global leader of manufacturing jet engines, Village officials remain aware of the issue and hope that the testing is temporary in nature, and hope that in any circumstance surrounding loud noise, efforts will be made by our business community to help mitigate industry-related impacts on residential areas.

All the roads that we are going to resurface this year are now done. Thank you for bearing with us during the disruption. We plan to repave additional roads next year; however, we are still in the process of determining which roads will be included in next year's resurfacing program. Normally, repaved streets last 20 to 25 years.

By Village Charter, our recently-elected Council will be sworn in on December 1 at 8:00 p.m. We will also elect the Vice Mayor and The President of Council. All are welcome to attend. Our State Senator, Bill Blessing, will preside.

We continue to work on food truck regulations and our residential zoning code by adding language that emphasizes the single-family nature of our well-kept housing stock. These are challenging matters with multiple legal issues to consider. There is still time to be heard by the Planning Commission.

As you can imagine, Election Day was a very long day. But the weather was great and I received a number of ideas and suggestions. We all Thank You for taking the time to vote.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

### *Season's Greetings from the Evendale Fire Department*

The holidays are upon us, and the Evendale Fire Department would like to wish the Village a happy and safe holiday season. Here are a few fire safety reminders to help keep your family and friends safe during this year's festivities:

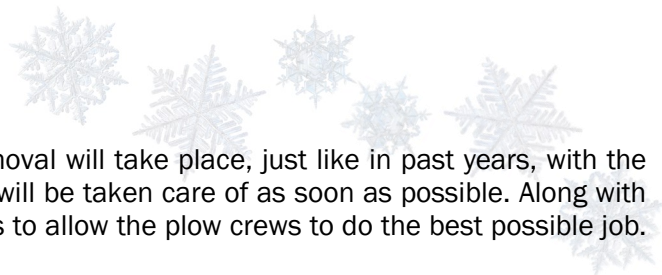
- Consider using battery-operated flameless candles, which can look, smell, and feel like real candles.
- Maintain at least 3 feet of space between candles and flammable items such as curtains and holiday decorations. Candles should be placed on a non-flammable surface and never left unattended.
- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Check your space heater before using it. If it's not operating correctly or the cord is damaged in any way, don't use it.
- Some decorative lighting and extension cords are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both. Review and only use appropriate lights and extension cords for your decorations. Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections, and only connect as many strands as recommended by the manufacturer. Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged. Never leave extension cords plugged in when not in use, and remember to turn off lights when leaving home or going to bed.
- Test your smoke alarms and remember to leave a clear exit path by keeping decorations away from windows and doors.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking holiday meals on the stove.

Please keep these holiday best practices in mind while celebrating this year. As always, feel free to call or stop by the station at any time with questions or concerns.

The neighborhood streets will be taken care of as soon as possible. Along with clearing snow, please remember to move vehicles off the roads to allow the plow crews to do the best possible job. Your help with this process will be appreciated.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

be prepared !!!!!*

### Be Prepared for Winter Driving

#### ***Prepare Your Car for Winter***

In addition to annual maintenance, here are some tips to winterize your car:

- Test your battery; battery power drops as the temperature drops
- Make sure the cooling system is in good working order
- If using all-season tires, check the tread on your tires and replace if less than 2/32 of an inch
- Check the tire pressure; tire pressure drops as the temperature drops
- Check your wiper blades and replace if needed
- Add wiper fluid rated for -30 degrees

#### ***Before You Start Out***

- Clean your car's external cameras and side view mirrors so you'll be able to see what's around you
- Remove dirt, ice and snow from sensors to allow the assistive-driving features like automatic emergency braking to work
- In frigid weather, you may want to warm up the car before you drive it
- To prevent [carbon monoxide poisoning](#), never leave a vehicle running in your garage – even with the garage door up
- If the forecast looks iffy, wait out the storm if possible; if you must travel, share your travel plans and route with someone before you leave

#### ***How to Avoid a Crash***

- Avoid using cruise control in wintry conditions
- Steer in the direction of a skid, so when your wheels regain traction, you don't have to overcorrect to stay in your lane
- Accelerate and decelerate slowly
- Increase following distance to 8 to 10 seconds
- If possible, don't stop when going uphill
- If visibility is severely limited due to a whiteout, pull off the road to a safe place and do not drive until conditions improve. Avoid pulling off onto the shoulder unless it is an absolute emergency. Limited visibility means other vehicles can't see yours on the shoulder.



## GORMAN HERITAGE FARM

### A Farm for the Community

From time to time people ask if Gorman Heritage Farm is my family's farm. Of course, the answer is no; the Farm is a nonprofit organization, and I am a staff member. But as you know, for over 160 years this was, in fact, a family farm, passed down through the generations. In 1996 it belonged to brother and sister, Jim and Dorothy Gorman. They grew up here, helped their parents work the land, and inherited the farm. During their lifetimes, Jim and Dorothy had seen all the neighboring family farms sold for development, so they were not terribly surprised when an offer was made for their property. What is surprising is that they turned it down! Jim and Dorothy turned down millions of dollars and donated their family farm to the community.

Today, Gorman Heritage Farm is open to the public, easily accessed, close to the city, and uniquely positioned to welcome visitors of all ages and abilities.

- When students plant a seed, taste a carrot, feed a chicken, and learn where food comes from during a field trip, **this is their farm.**
- When adults learn to grow their own vegetables or raise backyard chickens, **this is their farm.**
- When summer camp kids spend the week doing farm chores and then can't wait to take their family on a Friday tour, **this is their farm.**
- When former campers feel they have "grown up" here and return as staff members, **this is their farm.**
- When volunteers come week after week to teach education programs, help in the garden, care for animals, and restore native habitat, **this is their farm.**

As residents of the Village of Evendale, you, more than anyone, know that we are a farm for the community: your community! You understand how relaxing it can be to spend an afternoon here exploring with family and friends. You know the value of beautiful green space, the importance of accessible summer camps, the impact of high-quality field trip programs, and the delicious taste of fresh, local produce. **Evendale, this is your farm.**

We are grateful to the Village of Evendale for your support. The funding we receive from the Village helps us operate this vibrant, 122-acre working farm where we welcome over 25,000 people each year. Your support helps us fulfill our mission to cultivate a healthy community through farm-based education and experiences about food, sustainable agriculture, and the

natural world. With an operating budget of over \$1 million, the Farm raises additional funds through our Row by Row dinner, Sunflower Festival, grants, corporate sponsorships, and gifts from individuals like you.
