Dear Neighbors and Friends,

The Charter Review Committee will be headed by me, along with Council members Tom Sextro and Beth McDaniel. Also agreeing to serve are former Councilmember John Ranz and former Mayor Doug Lohmeier. The only proposed Charter amendment for review, as of now, is whether or not the Village should provide elected officials who are unable to attend public meetings in person, but who can participate via an online service such as Zoom or MS Teams, the ability to vote on ordinances and other actionable items. Ohio law permitted this during the pandemic which proved useful when in-person meeting quorums were difficult to achieve. If this option is found to be a reasonable possibility by the Committee, a proposed amendment would then be placed on the November 2023 ballot for vote by Evendale residents.

Councilman Steve Berke has agreed to work on a video Christmas greeting like we did two years ago. ICRC (our cable network) has agreed to help put it together. The video from two years ago was great!

I wanted to provide an update on a small fire that took place months ago in a multi-tenant business complex on Spartan Drive, located in the western-most portion of the Village. Several Evendale officials, including fire and building/zoning staff, have conducted multiple interior and exterior inspections to assure the site is safe to occupy and compliant with our minimum code requirements. Although progress in this case has been slow, Village officials hope to achieve voluntary compliance in all cases involving a Notice of Violation. However, the Village may pursue legal actions when little, if anything, is done to bring a property into compliance. The subject Complex, if maintained and managed compliantly, could be an attractive option/incubator for small businesses. Fortunately, the vast majority of homes and businesses in Evendale are very well maintained above and beyond code requirements. I appreciate the time and effort that residents and business owners put into keeping our community safe and attractive.

Hopefully, the fiber optics installation throughout our neighborhoods will soon be over and our yards can get back to normal. Believe me, the paint on the streets and drives will fade away. Please contact Alta Fiber first with any questions or concerns specific to your property or service. Alta should be responsive to your needs. If not, our Village Service Director or Administrator may potentially be of assistance, so please feel free to contact them.

Col. Joe Zeis, the Governor's Aerospace and Aviation Advisor, paid us a visit last month at Kinetic Vision. We spent several hours with him discussing AeroHub. He was most helpful with advice and was impressed with the development progress we've made to date. We are fortunate to have Kinetic in Evendale and appreciate the support and advocacy for AeroHub by Col. Zeis, and all local/state-level officials who have provided guidance or funding towards growing and expanding our local businesses.

Brush Chipping Regulations

- All items to be chipped are to be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday morning.
- Tree limbs and branches should be no larger than 8" in diameter.
- Pile tree limbs neatly with the stalk end at the curb.
- The following **CANNOT** be chipped: vines, garden waste, wood with nails or bushes with an excessive amount of dirt on roots. All vines and garden waste should be in bags for Rumpke pickup, not more than 50 pounds.
- Please remove the root ball from trees and bushes for pickup.

It is the responsibility of the resident to have contractors, tree surgeons, landscapers, etc., remove their own materials and waste from the property.

REMINDER:

Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged and set out at the curb for pickup by Rumpke, not more than 50 pounds.

Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions, please call the Service Department at 563-4338.

Reminder: Rumpke requests residents to place leaf bags and waste containers in the same spot. **Rumpke will only stop one time per house!**

Vacation Safety Tips



To deter potential burglars, you want to make sure your home looks lived in even while you are away. Statistics show that burglaries tend to rise in the summer months, which is peak vacation time

for most of us. Thieves know the best time to strike is when your home is vacant.

•**File a vacation report with the Evendale Police Department**

•**Tell a neighbor your travel plans.** Ask them to help keep an eye on your property and alert you of any suspicious activity.

•**Lock all your windows and doors.** Don't forget about doors leading to the garage or second-story windows.

•**Have mail and newspaper delivery stopped.**

•**Hire someone to help you keep up on yard work.** An overgrown lawn is a dead giveaway that no one's at home.

•**Don't post your travel plans on social media**—if a burglar spots your post, it can turn your home into a target.

•**Stay off social media.** Don't tip criminals off by sharing too much information on your social networks. Refrain from posting photos, status updates, or "checking in" while on vacation. Even if you have the highest security settings on Facebook and Twitter, your personal information could still be seen by unwanted eyes.

•**Tell friends and family at home your itinerary.**

•**Keep cash and credit cards in separate places.** Never carry your credit cards, cash, and passport at the same time. You'll want to keep some cash in your wallet, and then stash the rest in a pocket or money pouch. If you have a safe in your hotel room, leave the majority of your cash there and only bring what you'll need for the day.

•**Make a copy of your passport.** You'll want to make two copies of your passport. Leave one copy at home with a trusted friend or family member and take another copy with you.

•**Do a security sweep of your hotel room.** Always keep your hotel door locked and never answer it for someone you don't know.

You can never be too careful, especially when it comes to traveling. Make sure things are safe at home and while you are traveling by taking the necessary precautions.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

Summer Safety Tips

We are entering into the summer months and the Evendale Fire Department would like to give you a few pointers to help safely enjoy the season.

Grilling Safety:

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), between years 2014-2018, fire departments responded to an average of 8,900 home fires involving grills, and an average of 19,700 patients were seen in the emergency room due to injuries involving grills. To better enjoy cooking and avoid becoming a statistic, please keep the following grill safety tips in mind:

- Keep a 3-foot safe zone around your grill. This includes a building's siding and eaves, deck railings, as well as your children and pets.
- Open your gas grill before lighting it to ensure proper ignition and avoid an overabundance of gas and flare-up.
- Inspect your gas grill at the beginning of the season to make sure all parts are functioning properly. The NFPA reports that 10 percent of house fires involving gas grills and 22 percent of outdoor gas grill fires were caused by grill defects such as leaks or breaks.
- Keep an eye on your grill. Do not walk away from a lit grill to avoid fire and injury.
- Clean your grill and brush after each use. A buildup of grease can become fuel for fire.
- Discard used grill coals in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.

Pool Safety:

Keep the following safety tips in mind this summer as you and your family enjoy some pool time:

- Teach your children how to swim. Whether through local lessons or through practicing with them, the more confident children are in the pool, the better understanding they can have of important safety rules.
- Never leave a child unattended. If you need to leave, even for a moment, ask another adult to watch the child if available, or remove the child from the pool area. Accidents can happen in a split second.
- Teach children to stay away from pool drains. Hair, limbs, or bathing suits can get stuck in a drain and become difficult for a child to overcome. This creates panic and exhaustion and can lead to a tragic accident.
- Ensure residential pools have proper barriers. To avoid children wandering into a pool unsupervised, make sure your pool area is protected by proper fencing, alarms and covers.
- Learn CPR. A bystander who knows how to properly perform CPR can mean the difference between life and death during a drowning emergency. The fire department's Public Education program offers CPR instruction; please contact the station for further information.

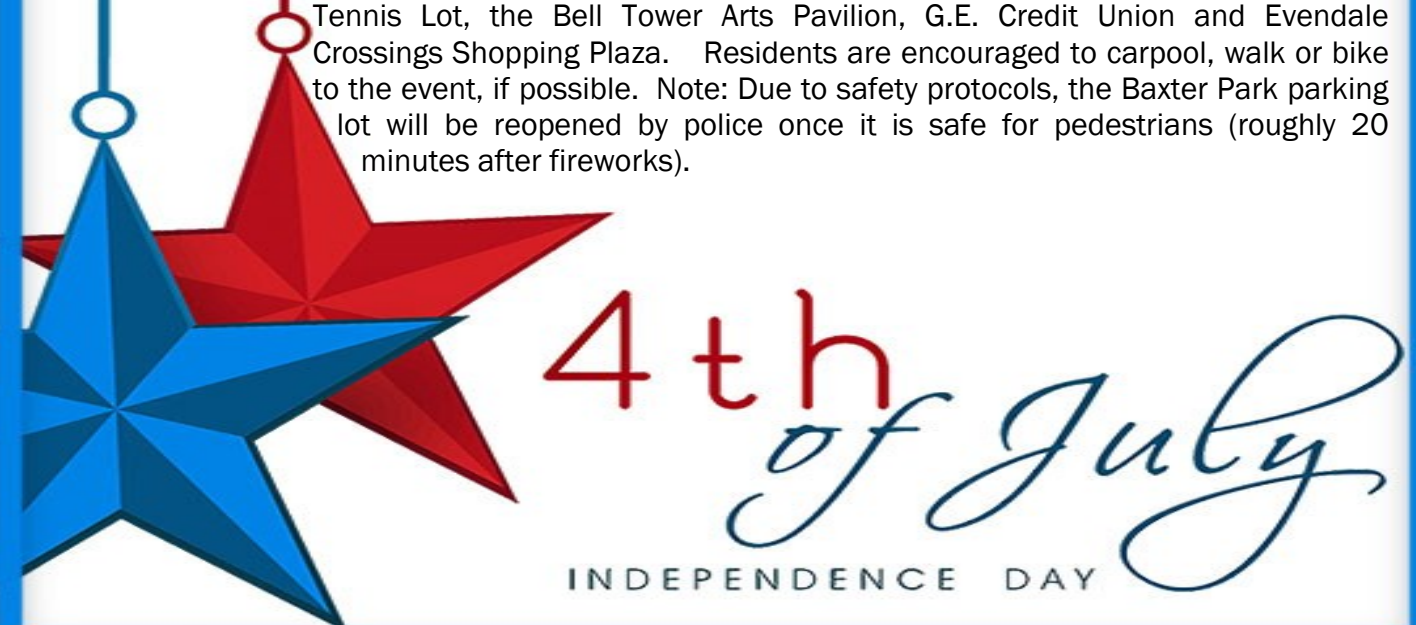
