Dear Neighbors and Friends,

Discussions about relocating the Cincinnati Police gun range continue to move forward between key project stakeholders, most notably the City of Cincinnati and Hamilton County. Concept plans and cost estimates are being finalized for a new Regional Safety Service Center, to include an expanded range, at the County’s existing range in Colerain Township. According to a few recent press releases, the County should break ground in a month or two; however, the overall project is still in very early stages. The City and County, with assistance from the federal government, have pledged about \$21 million of the needed \$27 million for Phase I of the project. Evendale officials have been active participants in project meetings with particular interest in redevelopment opportunities for the existing Range once it’s moved. More information to come in future letters.

Evendale received several bids for new pickleball courts, with the lowest and best bid being awarded at \$127,870. We have already spent \$25,000 on recoating and coloring the tennis courts so they are ready for spring. Pickleball is an up-and-coming sport; but there is a downside; the noise, if close to residential areas, can be annoying. I don’t think we will have that problem.

The Village is buying approximately 4 ½ acres of land for \$70,000 from the Ohio Department of Transportation. The acreage is left over land west of I-75 that was once part of a ramp system demolished several years ago during the “Thru the Valley” freeway widening project. This land will be integrated into AeroHub, along with the Firing Range, when it becomes available for redevelopment.

The new street cameras, with enhanced license plate reader technology, have been installed. Blue Ash, Sharonville, and several other communities also have the same system. The cameras will better enable law enforcement to regionally coordinate and provide services.

On a side note, I could not help but notice that the State of Ohio has a grant to study the feasibility of a railroad line from Cincinnati to Dayton to Columbus to Cleveland. When I was in the Ohio legislature, we did the same study some 30 years ago. Back then, we found that you could not use existing freight tracks; rather, new lines had to be installed. Consequently, the State would have had to acquire new right-of-way from thousands of private property owners. Additionally, new lines would require hundreds of highway/streets over or under passes. Add on the cost of equipment, maintenance, etc., and the costs were huge. We concluded that it would be cheaper to buy an airline ticket for anyone who wanted to go to Cleveland from Cincinnati or vice-versa. I’m not sure how successful a new study will result in different conclusions and challenges.

Ah, spring is almost here.

Work From Home - If you requested a refund from your work place city for the tax year 2022 because you worked from home, your credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality (Evendale Individual Income Tax Return, Line 5c) must be reduced by the amount of the refund received from your work place city.

Taxpayer Assistance - In-person taxpayer assistance remains by appointment only at this time. Taxpayer assistance is also available by telephone and by email.

Dropping off Tax Information - If you need to visit our office to drop off tax return information or to drop off your completed tax return, you may do so at the Administration Lobby window, M-F 8:00am to 4:00pm. You may also use the secured Tax Department Drop Box located in the Lobby of our Police Department, after normal business hours. The Police Department Lobby is open 24/7.

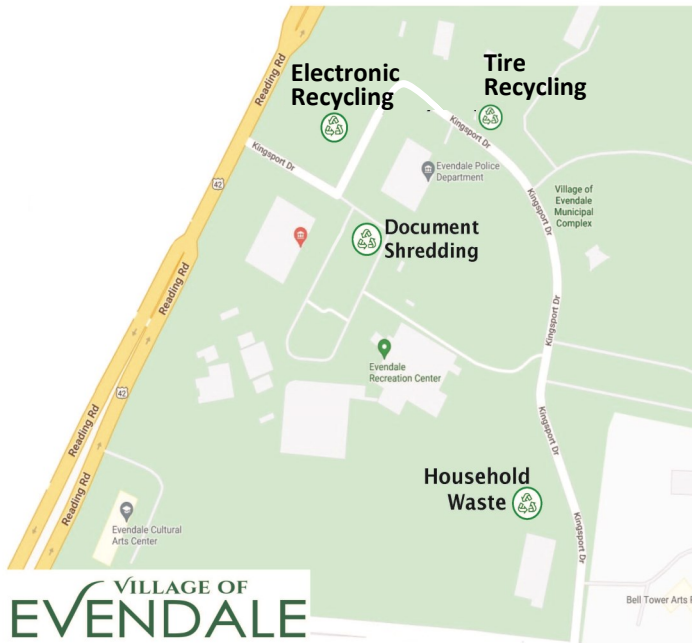

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Learn CPR, Be the Difference, Save a Life

At the Evendale Fire Department, one of our primary goals outside of responding to your emergencies is to provide the public with education to help provide the best outcomes for those emergencies. As a resident of Evendale, the most impactful education that we can provide you is our CPR/AED and First Aid training.

The American Heart Association reports that more than 350,000 cardiac arrests occur outside of a hospital setting each year and that early bystander CPR can double or triple a patient’s chance of survival. When these tragedies occur, time is a critical factor in determining a patient’s survivability and quality of life. We preach early 911 activation, but the reality is that it takes time for the EFD to arrive on scene and initiate critical care. During this time you, the bystander, **CAN BE THE DIFFERENCE!** Even under the most ideal circumstances it can take upwards of 4 to 7 minutes to activate the 911 emergency response system, have the proper resources deployed, and then have those resources respond to the scene. In that time, we are counting on early onset bystander CPR to make the difference for this patient.

CPR/AED and First Aid training is a way for you to be the difference and save a life. As many witnessed in the recent near-tragedy in a nationally televised professional football game, early quality CPR and AED activation can not only impact a patient’s survivability during a cardiac arrest, it also greatly impacts their quality of life in recovering from that event.

Our CPR program at the EFD is geared toward everyday citizens and nearly anyone can do it! We provide the training and knowledge for you to recognize the emergency, properly activate emergency services, and provide high quality care until the EFD can arrive and continue that care. Our goal at the EFD is to train as many bystanders as we can, so that the general public is in better hands in the time it takes for us to respond to these emergencies.

These detectors are available at the firehouse for your confidence. Due to the ever changing supply chain, we have recently had to adjust the cost of these devices. Current prices for these devices on station are: Carbon Monoxide Detectors - \$20.00, Smoke Detectors - \$10.00, Flashing Emergency Bulbs - no charge, Weather Alert Radio - \$20.00.
