

VILLAGE OF EVENDALE

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

I am pleased to report that Evendale has been invited to participate in a 30+ member consortium of Southwest Ohio local governments, universities, and private businesses, including GE Aerospace. The Consortium is seeking \$65 million in grant funding from the Federal Economic Development Agency for advanced regional aerospace innovation. Our AeroHub project was specifically identified in the Round 1 grant application. Additionally, to further facilitate regional prosperity, we introduced Senate Bill 75 through our State Senator, Bill Blessing. The Bill would enable two municipalities, without a Township, to form a Joint Economic Development District (JEDD). In past newsletters, I've talked about the City of Cincinnati and Hamilton County working together to relocate the Cincinnati Firing Range in Evendale, to a new site in Colerain Township. The City and County have made significant planning and funding progress on the new Range but it will likely take 2+/- years before the new facility is completed. The vacated Evendale site would be perfect for commercial redevelopment. Evendale has already rezoned the land for inclusion in AeroHub. Having the ability to form a JEDD with our neighbors, Lincoln Heights, could help their community redevelop their commercial land along I-75. Although HB 75 recently passed the Senate, it now must pass the House. The Bill would then need the Governor's signature before it becomes effective. We are hopeful this will occur in 2024.

In October, The Gorman Heritage Farm had a record-setting Sunflower Festival with 8,000 people attending the two-day event and selling \$18,000 in flowers (the previous record was \$13,000). Total festival revenue was \$120,000, also a new record. WOW and Congratulations! Additionally, the Farm was recently recognized for its contributions to the area; I attended the dedication of their H2Ohio project. Farm CEO Nicole Gunderman and her team deserve praise.

The Planning Commission is currently reviewing potential revisions to our zoning code definitions and rental property regulations. While the Village cannot prohibit a property owner from renting their home we have codes prohibiting short-term rental situations. Additionally, the Village does not permit multi-family or apartment uses. The proposed revisions affirm our commitment to protecting the single-family nature of our residential neighborhoods. The Planning Commission meets every third Tuesday of the month; however, please check our website for meeting agendas, date/time changes, or cancellations.

Phase III improvements to the Recreation Center will start soon which includes the old gym and fitness center areas. Improvements will include: replacing carpets and painting throughout the Southwest end of the Center and expanding Miss Patti's Childcare Room. Also, we are exploring reimagining our racquetball court area due to low use and water damage. I will keep you posted.

Don't forget the Town Meeting on November 5th. It starts at 5:00 p.m. in the Recreation Center. Then remember to vote on November 7th (polls are open 6:30 a.m.- 7:30 p.m.).

Wetland Project Ribbon Cutting

We were happy to welcome Mayor Finan to the Ribbon Cutting for our Wetland on Friday, September 29th. This new addition

to the Farm was funded by a grant from the H2Ohio Ohio River Basin program, supported by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. And it has already demonstrated its storm water thus reducing damage to our site, and allowing sediment, nutrients, and bacteria to settle



before the water to trickles into our stream. This stream is a tributary of the Mill Creek which in turn feeds into the Ohio River - our region's source of drinking water. Wetlands are a farm's good friend, helping us alleviate non point-source pollution and enhancing the biodiversity of our site. We have already seen wild birds enjoying the wetland that had not been spotted on our property before, including sandpipers, herons, and migratory warblers! Be on the lookout in early 2024 for some more.

Sustainable Home Food Production

On Sunday, November 12th from 1:00-3:30, join our Garden Educator, Jason Kamp, for an introduction to growing your own

food at home. This program begins with an indoor talk and provides take-home resources to assist your efforts. It then heads outside (weather depending) for a guided tour of our gardens. Come learn the ins and outs of bed preparation, healthy soil, vegetable selection and timing, edible landscaping, weed management, and more.
