Dear Neighbors and Friends,

November 5th at 5:00 pm has been set for our Village Town Meeting. This is required by our Charter wherein Council and the Mayor report about the affairs of the Village. Residents are invited to attend and questions are encouraged.

Our police and fire departments have many aspects to consider when providing services, including mental health. Sgt. Tina McCormick has taken it upon herself to take some training, mostly from Mental Health America of Northern Kentucky and Southwest Ohio. Topics covered have been Advanced C.I.T. De-escalation, Foundation of Peer Support, Crisis Intervention Team, and working with Special Populations. She also attends monthly meetings and events with law enforcement and social service mental health specialists. The County has a mental health team but they are often spread thin. Thank you, Sgt. McCormick, for taking proactive measures to identify and address mental health as a potential factor when rendering police or fire services.

Last month, some of us had a chance to tour the Queen City Sports complex (formerly Sports Plus) with the new owners. The clean-up work that has been done to date is impressive, with plans to invest several million dollars in building improvements over time. The Cincinnati Cyclones, the city's minor league hockey team, will practice there. The team is affiliated with the New York Rangers. The facility owners are in the process of installing a new locker room for the team. They have two sheets of ice now and are studying the potential to expand to three. Queen City Sports will continue to host basketball, volleyball, and other sports. Even though the Cyclones will train there, they will continue to be open to outside groups. The new owners and building improvements are a wonderful addition to the Village.

The Millcreek Valley Conservancy District is looking for a new member for its Board. It normally has three members. The District has struggled recently to identify and implement a cost-effective program for maintaining creek infrastructure; however, it is important to our Village. Along with Sharonville, we are the two largest communities in which the District owns or controls land. They are overseen by a Common Pleas judge who has the power of taxation. There are at least three more conservation districts in Ohio and all seem to run well. Miami Valley in Dayton is the closest.

If you are 18 years or older or new to the Village, make sure you are registered to vote here. The voter registration deadline is October 10th. You can register to vote, check your voting status, or even request an absentee ballot at votehamiltoncountyohio.gov. Don't forget to vote on November 7th!

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS FROM THE EVENDALE POLICE

- Children should never be allowed to go out alone on Halloween.
- Children should never eat any treats until they have been examined.
- Advise children that they should never enter strangers' homes.
- Never invite children into your home.
- Children should never accept rides from strangers.
- Set a specific time limit for your children to be out on Halloween night.
- Instruct children not to stray from their group.
- A responsible adult should escort children while trick-or-treating.
- Children should walk, not run, during their trick-ortreat activities.
- Parents should know what route their children will be taking.
- All costumes should be made of light-colored, fireproof material.
- Realistic replica firearms should never be used.
- Masks and wigs should not be worn if they impair vision.
- Children should look in all directions before crossing the street.
- Use of flashlights and reflective clothing is strongly encouraged.
- Motorists should drive slowly, yield to pedestrians and watch out for Trick-or-Treaters darting into the street

October is Fire Prevention Month

October is recognized every year by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) as National Fire Prevention Month. Your Evendale Fire Department will be visiting with our local schools to pass along fire safety education throughout October and we would like to take the opportunity to remind you about a few fire safety best practices. The theme for this year's Fire Prevention Month is "Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention." This year's focus on cooking safety works to educate the public about simple but important steps they can take to help reduce the risk of fire when cooking at home, keeping themselves and those around them safe. The NFPA provides a comprehensive check list to aid your household to prepare for, recognize, and react to common fire hazards you may encounter while cooking. It goes as follows:

- Always keep a close eye on what you are cooking.
 For foods with longer cooking times, such as those that are simmering or baking, set a timer to help monitor them carefully.
- Clear the cooking area of combustible items and keep everything that can burn, such as dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging, and paper towels.
- Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove.
 Keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.
- Create a "kid and pet-free zone" of at least three feet around the cooking area and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

Along with these preparedness guidelines, we recommend having a kitchen rated fire extinguisher and would like to emphasize a few key pieces of advice if you do encounter any kind of kitchen fire.

Fire extinguishers are only meant to extinguish small, container fires such as a trashcan fire.

If you have a small cooking fire that is contained to the cooking surface:

- On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. Use appropriate oven mitt to avoid burns to skin.
- For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. This should dampen and extinguish the flames.

If you have any doubt, just get out.

- Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire.
- Call 9-1-1 from outside the home.

 Leaf bags will be issued only on Saturdays from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm and Wednesdays from 1:00 pm to 7:00pm., at the Service Department. Limit 75 bags per household.

For 2023 the dates will be:

Saturday, September 23, 30, October 7, 14, 21 & 28 Wednesday, October 11 & 18

- 2. Each household will have to sign for the bags. (Proof of residency may be required)
- 3. You may only pick up the bags for your household.
- 4. There are a limited amount of bags available and are issued on a first come basis.

IMPORTANT: When setting bags at the curb for Rumpke, place the bags in the same spot as your trash can. Rumpke will only make one (1) stop per residence.


