Dear Neighbors and Friends,



We opened our new pickleball courts in the Village several weeks ago. As you know, it is the fastest growing sport in America. The game was started in Washington State by three fathers looking to create an activity they could enjoy with their families. They found a badminton court, a net, several ping pong paddles, and a whiffle ball. The name "pickleball" was coined by the wife of one of the founders who was a fan of the boat racing sport, Crew. At college crew events, non-starter crew members were mixed together in meant-for-fun "pickle boat" races. Since her husband's newfound game was a mix of several other games, she suggested calling it "pickleball". Today, 8.9 million people are playing pickleball on 11,000 courts in the US. With our new courts, there are now 11,004! Before playing, be sure to review the rules and take precautionary steps to prevent injury. To help residents safely learn the sport, the Recreation Department offers introductory pickleball classes (see page 9 for more information)

The State of Ohio is now offering up to \$1,000 for children to attend learning camps like the day camps offered by our Recreation Center, Gorman Heritage Farm, and ISpace. However, the money is not for sports camps. To learn more, and how to apply, go to education.ohio.gov/OhioACE.

You may have noticed more Metro buses running through the Village these days. That is because Reading Road has been designated as a Bus Rapid Transit corridor. SORTA now provides service every 10-15 minutes with multiple stops along Reading Rd. and Glendale-Milford Rd, west of Reading. I recently had a fruitful meeting with Metro to discuss the location of some stops. I know that we do not have many residents who ride the bus. But, we do have non-resident employees working at multiple Evendale businesses who use public transportation to/from work. Evendale officials are currently working with SORTA on route options. Please let us know if you have any suggestions for Metro.

In last month's newsletter, I mentioned our sale of Lot 4 in AeroHub to The General Tool Company. Village officials quickly reviewed and approved building plans enabling construction to start in August. On July 31st, we held a ceremonial ground breaking with GTC leadership and representatives from other state/local agencies, including JobsOhio, REDI Cincinnati and Alloy who helped with the project. Thank you and congratulations to all involved.






POLICE DEPARTMENT

When to stop for a school bus in Ohio

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.







TWO-LANE HIGHWAY WITH CENTER TURN LANE

THREE-LANE HIGHWAY

If the bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.





FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY

FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY WITH CENTER TURN LANE

Failure to stop for a school bus adds 2 points to your license in Ohio and is punishable by fines up to \$500. You must appear in court and the judge has the discretion to suspend your driver's license for up to one year. A driver who injures a pedestrian while failing to comply with school bus safety laws can face both criminal charges and civil liability. Those liabilities can include the victim's medical expenses, lost wages, rehabilitation, and non-economic damages, such as pain and suffering.

Preparing Your Child for an Emergency

Does your child know how to recognize an emergency and call for help? We at the Evendale Fire Department would like to stress the importance of our community's youth being able to act in the event of an emergency. An emergency is any situation which could risk or has already caused harm to health, life, property, or environment.

While children at different ages will have differing abilities in the recognition of an emergency, we would like to emphasize the importance of teaching our children how to identify a problem and react at an early age. Whether the issue is a medical emergency, fire, or police matter, parents and grandparents should begin teaching children as young as 3 how to comprehend an emergency and call for help. At this young age, they may not be able to remember or process everything, but continuing to review the information could make a difference in the years to come. If a child is alone or something has happened to a caretaker, it is important that our children know how to use a phone to dial 911, or where to go to alert an adult. Many smartphones can call 911 without using a passcode to unlock them. Review this feature with your children and explain what 911 is and when they should call.

When calling for help, we should be teaching our children to memorize the following information to better facilitate us in our response:

- Both parents' full names.
- A full home address.
- At least one caretaker's phone number.
- How many people live in the house.
- Any major allergy in the family. For example, this may be extremely important if a caretaker is suffering a medical emergency from a food allergy.

Please take the time to begin teaching your children these basic steps to recognizing and reacting to an emergency. We encourage you to practice how your child will respond to an emergency through role playing scenarios such as fire escape plans or medical emergencies and accidents.

Why do we see different crops from Cooper Road each year?



One of the sustainable agriculture methods we practice at Gorman Heritage Farm is crop rotation. This means we plant different crops in each field each year in a rotating cycle. The fields that can be seen from Cooper Road are divided into long sections running north to south, and labeled with letters B through F. Our crops Farm Encounters Walk -

rotate in a 5-year sequence, so field B will be planted with corn one year, soybeans the next, wheat the following year, and sunflowers the year after that. The final year it will be planted with a cover crop to replenish nutrients in the soil. 2023 is the fourth year of our 5-year rotation, so Field B is where you'll find the sunflowers on October 7th and 8th for our annual Sunflower Festival! In addition to being beautiful, sunflowers are a great

addition to a crop rotation system because their long taproots grow deeper than other grass crops, like wheat and corn, so they can reach moisture and nutrients at depths that other crops cannot. Crop rotation also helps to control diseases and reduces pest issues because each crop has different diseases that attack it. When you change the crop, the disease pathogens die. While it would be convenient for our festival-goers if the sunflowers were always in Field A. close to the gardens Celebrate fall on the Farm at our annual Sunflower and farmyard, sunflowers should not be planted in the Festival this October 7th and 8th! Wander through fields same field more than once every three to four years of cut-your-own-sunflowers (\$1 per stem), visit education because they are highly susceptible to a disease called stations, enjoy live music, hop on a hayride or mule sclerotinia head rot. The next time you drive or walk down carriage ride, and peruse local goods from craft vendors. Cooper Road, take a look at the fields and see if you can and food trucks at Gorman Heritage Farm.
