Dear Neighbors and Friends,

On April 2, 2024, GE Aerospace will become an independent company. It will be headquartered in The Village of Evendale, for the first time in its 131-year history, becoming this region's third-largest publicly traded company. It will also be the newest Fortune 500 company with \$32 billion in 2023 revenue. The Village of Evendale is fortunate to have the GE Aerospace headquarters located in our village and be part of our business community. It should make you feel pretty good as an Evendale Resident.

Good news from the State of Ohio - unemployment in Ohio is down to 3.7%. That is virtually full employment for the State.

In February, the Ohio Supreme Court upheld a temporary state law (HB197) originally adopted in 2020, to assist cities with their ability to maintain services during the pandemic. The Court case challenged the constitutionality of HB197. The ruling last month confirmed the law was constitutional, and that we do not have to issue refunds requested for 2020 local taxes withheld from remote workers whose employer was located in Evendale. Some municipalities in Ohio had initially suspended decisions for issuing 2020 refunds, pending the outcome of the court cases. Other municipalities, including the Village, denied the refund requests when received, based upon the actions of the Governor and the legislation adopted by the General Assembly at that time.

The Fire Department has an ordinance that will bring us up to date with the state's fire code. A couple of new things will be needed. First, for registered rental property owners a lockbox with an entry key for the firefighters will be required. The estimated cost is about \$250.00. Also, new or remodeled buildings that are used commercially and are over 5,000 sq. feet will be required to contain a fire sprinkler system. The final reading and vote on the ordinance will be at the April Council meeting.

The Service Department did a great job on the sand volleyball courts. In addition to corralling the sand back into the courts, they have built a bit of seating around the edges. I always thought the courts did not look good with the sand spilling everywhere; this is a very nice improvement to our volleyball courts.

The cable TV companies continue to lose customers. Fewer customers means lower income that the Inter-Community Regulatory Commission (ICRC) receives. Spectrum was down 3% and AltaFiber was down 2%. Just one important service that ICRC provides is that they televise our Council meetings, as well as some special events in the Village. I am afraid that a continued reduction will put ICRC out of business.

April 20th is our annual shred and recycling day. We are open from 9:00 am until 12:00 Noon. It is a good chance to declutter your home.

2023 Evendale Income Tax Return - The due date for filing the 2023 Evendale Income Tax Return, and paying the tax due, is April 15, 2024. Tax forms are available on our website, https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department and in the lobby of the Village Administration Department.

E-file/E-pay – The E-file system is available for most individuals to file their 2023 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return. An E-pay system is included with the E-file system, allowing for payment of the balance of tax due by credit card. The E-file system may be accessed by visiting our website at https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department. Credit card payments will be accepted without assessment of a convenience fee by the 3rd party credit card processor (some restrictions may apply). VISA, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

NEW THIS YEAR – You may also make an online tax payment by credit card at any time, even if you are not filing your tax return via the E-file system. Visit our website at https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department and select "Make a Tax Payment Online." Credit card payments will be accepted without assessment of a convenience fee by the 3rd party credit card processor (some restrictions may apply). VISA, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

Work From Home - If you requested a refund from your work place city for the tax year 2023 because you worked from home, your resident credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality (Evendale Individual Income Tax Return, Line 5c) must be reduced for the refund received from your work place city.

Taxpayer Assistance – In-person taxpayer assistance remains by appointment only at this time. Taxpayer assistance is also available by telephone and by email.

Dropping off Tax Information - If you need to visit our office to drop off tax return information or to drop off your completed tax return, you may do so at the Administration Lobby window, M-F 8:00am to 4:00pm. After normal business hours, you may also use the secured Tax Department Drop Box located in the Lobby of our Police Department. The Police Department Lobby is open 24/7.



Key Lock Box Program

Evendale fire department is starting a key lock box program that is available for residents within the community. The benefits of this program are that it allows emergency responders to enter your home quicker to provide medical assistance, reduces property damage while trying to gain access to your residence for a medical emergency, as well as being more efficient and quicker with re-securing your home after an incident. These boxes utilize a master key that is specific to the Village of Evendale.

How do they work you ask? After purchasing your unit, these boxes can be placed over your door or secured to your house if you so choose. Once they have been secured to your house, a member of the fire department will come out and place a copy of your house key in the box and then re-secure the box. The fire department and police department are the only ones who have keys to access these boxes.

There are two options for these boxes. These companies are Knox Box and Roper Lock Box LLC. The cost for a Residential Knox Box is roughly \$210 per box. The Rope Lock Box is roughly \$40.50 per box. These boxes are purchased by the homeowner and shipped to your address. Once you receive them you can contact the fire department at 513-563-2248 for someone to come out and place a key in your box.




